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Noteworthy Cases & Operational Support

- Region 10 Update for the APD Public Safety Training Center/DTAF during the DTAF/Stop Cop City week of action scheduled for June 24, 2023 through July 1, 2023, GBI, FBI, ATF, and/or APD responded to the following:
 - o June 28, fire was set to a train signal box owned and operated by Norfolk Southern Railways in DeKalb County.
 - O June 30, the residence of an architect working on the "Cop City" project was vandalized with spray painting on the driveway and damage to vehicle tires.
 - O July 1, burning of six APD motorcycles that were stored at the old APD Training Academy. Improvised incendiary devices, both burned and uninitiated, were discovered and collected to be rendered safe and processed for latent evidence. Three APD patrol cars were vandalized (broken windows and spray painting) at the Precinct on Memorial Drive. An effort was made to burn the patrol cars as well, but the suspects were scared off by the approach of a passer-by.
 - o July 2, the residence of an executive of a construction firm was vandalized with spray painting, damage to swimming pool, dead rodents left, and feces scattered on patio furniture.
 - o July 4, a bulldozer owned by a contractor who worked on the "Cop City" project was burned.
 - O July 5, DTAF and "Stop Cop City" graffiti was discovered on a train trestle in Atlanta.
 - o Protests around Atlanta at Gresham Park and Cadence Bank resulted in one arrest of a protestor who threw rotten meat at officers.
 - Several MARTA and APD motorcycle helmets were stolen.
- Appalachian Regional Drug Enforcement Office Following a several months-long drug investigation into a fentanyl distribution organization operating in Jackson and Banks Counties, five people were charged with multiple felony drug offenses. June 29, 2023 arrests: William "Faye" Lomack, age 48, of Maysville, GA; Tony Clough, age 54, of Marion, VA; Chante Presley, age 28, of Richland, VA; Nicole Pressley, age 37, of Maysville, GA; and Stephanie "Sticks" Guthrie, age 38, of Winder, GA. On June 29, 2023, police arrested Lomack after a traffic stop in Commerce. Lomack had approximately 450 grams of suspected fentanyl, two firearms, and a large amount of cash on him. Police executed search warrants at a Commerce, GA motel and a home in Maysville, both connected to Lomack. Police found suspected fentanyl in the motel room and seized four firearms, over 28 grams of suspected fentanyl, and approximately 28 grams of suspected methamphetamine from the Maysville home. Police also arrested Nicole Pressley at the home. Clough was arrested with Lomack during the traffic stop. Chante Presley was arrested at the motel room. The Banks County Sheriff's Office, Jackson County Sheriff's

Office, Stephens County Sheriff's Office, FBI-Gainesville, Georgia State Patrol, GBI's Human Exploitation and Trafficking Unit, and Appalachian Regional Drug Enforcement Office assisted with this investigation.

- Office of Special Investigations (OSI) Cold Case Unit (CCU) The Coleman-Baker Act (CBA) request webform has been on the GBI website Home page since June 30, 2023. As of July 27, 2023, CCU has received 25 requests. Twenty-one of those requests have been or are in the process of being denied as GBI did not investigate the death. One case is under review to determine eligibility. The Rhonda Sue Coleman case (Region 4) is one of the CBA requests that was accepted. CCU has also initiated four independent Cold Case Reviews in Regions 2, 7, 12, and 10.
 - OSI is working with Investigative Computer Services to update the GBI website
 with additional reporting instructions to reduce the amount of CBA requests that
 were not initially investigated by the GBI.
- From January 1 to July 31, 2023, the GBI has investigated a total of 58 Officer Involved Shootings (OIS). OIS number 58 was on July 31, 2023. Region 10 responded to a request by the Brookhaven Police Department in reference to a subject armed with a knife walking around yelling at customers at the Town Brookhaven Shopping Center. After officers attempted to speak with the subject, he became angry and threw his drink at the officers. One of the officers deployed his Taser, but it was ineffective. As the subject charged at the officers, a second officer discharged his firearm, striking the subject. During the incident, the subject dropped a saw blade. He was taken to Grady Memorial Hospital for his injuries and pronounced dead shortly after arrival. No officers were injured during the incident. The GBI will continue its independent investigation. Once complete, the case file will be given to the DeKalb County District Attorney's Office for review.

- Senior Managing Attorney Lindsay Gardner and GTF Crime Intelligence Analyst Keisha Norman conducted GBI Gang Database Training at the Georgia Gang Investigators Association Summer Conference held in Athens, GA, July 10-14, 2023.
- Senior Managing Attorney Lindsay Gardner and Gang Task Force Special Agent in Charge Ken Howard conducted GBI Gang Database Training at the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police Summer Training Conference in Savannah, GA, July 23-26, 2023.

Division of Forensic Sciences

- GBI Medical Examiners Dr. Kimberly Johnson and Dr. Samantha Mattox began full-time employment on August 1, 2023.
- In July 2023, the MEO hosted Personnel Retrieval and Processing Company (PRP) Marines prior to their first deployment.

Georgia Crime Information Center

• GCIC Teams are reviewing the results and documentation gathered from the onsite Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) Fieldprint audit held in July.

Investigative Division

- Eighty-five applicants took part in the Special Agent Assessments held on August 5, 2023, at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center.
- The Child Exploitation and Computer Crimes Unit's (CEACC) Federal Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) grant 6-month progress report was completed. CEACC received 14,964 CyberTips from January June 2023, which is more CyberTips than CEACC received for the entire year in 2021.

Personnel Matters

- After 32 years of service with the GBI, Division of Forensic Sciences Impressions Department Forensic Technician Phillip Prater is retiring effective September 1, 2023.
- Task Force Agent Richard Wallace (DOC) with the GBI Middle GA Gang Task Force received the Georgia Gang Investigators Association (GGIA) Central Region Investigator of the Year award, and Special Agent Rebecca Herold with the Metro Gang Task Force received the GGIA Eastern Region Investigator of the Year award. Both agents were presented their awards on July 11, 2023, at the GGIA Conference in Athens, GA.
- On July 25, 2023, during the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police (GACP) Summer Training Conference, GBI Special Agent Christian Johnson was named the 2023 GACP Outstanding Police Officer of the Year.

Promotions Effective August 2023

- Governor Brian Kemp appointed Chris Hosey to Director of the Georgia Bureau of Investigation, effective August 1, 2023.
- Director Chris Hosey appointed Scott Dutton as Assistant Director, effective August 16, 2023.
- Katie Walker was promoted to Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC) of the GBI's Metro Gang Task Force in Conyers, effective August 1, 2023.



Investigative Hours Expended - YTD FY2023





GEORGIA APPLICANT PROCESSING SERVICE (GAPS) PROJECT

Project Description - The Information Services section of GCIC is seeking to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide an applicant fingerprinting solution that will electronically capture and submit applicant fingerprints to the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) and provide Rap Back services. The selected vendor shall also handle receiving fingerprint search results and disseminating results to the requestor.

Monthly Update - The SOW & Hosting Agreement was signed off by NEC and GBI. GCIC is awaiting DOAS approval of a 3-year contract extension. Once approved, purchase order will be provided to NEC to begin Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) upgrade project activities. Weekly project calls continue between GBI and Fieldprint and a weekly call was established for GBI, Fieldprint and state agencies to discuss issues presented by their users that have developed since the May 1, 2023, go-live date.

GEORGIA LAW ENFORCEMENT MESSAGE SWITCH (GLEMS)

Project Description - The message switch provides a means of communication between federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies throughout the state of Georgia, the United States, and other countries, and to take advantage of new features and advances in technology. GCIC is looking to upgrade or replace this system.

Monthly Update - GCIC continues to work with Datamaxx and other SOG Stakeholders to test the production connections and prepare for a third quarter deployment.

HUMAN RESOURCE (HR) TIMESHEET PROJECT

Project Description - Enhancement of the application used by non-sworn units of the GBI for tracking time.

Monthly Update - There are no updates this reporting period.

NATIONAL SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY (NSOR) NOTIFICATION PROJECT

Project Description - The NSOR project will provide Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) the ability to receive NSOR responses as a part of the criminal history background check, in compliance with Federal, State, and local laws to make complete/accurate fitness determinations.

Monthly Update - The internal GBI team met with NEC and Equivant to discuss restart of the NSOR project. The internal project team is currently reviewing FBI specifications documents for NSOR notifications to DECAL and project notes.

RAP BACK PROJECT

Project Description - The Rap Back (RB) project will provide the ability to receive ongoing status notifications of criminal history activity reported on individuals holding positions of trust. Georgia's Rap Back System will include the retention of applicant fingerprints, the implementation of an FBI Rap Back Subscription on such prints, and the creation of a validation process for authorized entities to manage such subscriptions. The Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) is requesting proposals for the Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) with the Federal Rap Back Subscription Service. The objective of this procurement is to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide real-time, end -to-end, on-line submission of fingerprint images and data, designed to ensure high performance combined with high availability and reliability to the GBI Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS).

Monthly Update - The eRFP was released on 5/24/2023 with a 31-day closing for all bids. Responses to questions were provided to the vendors. Evaluation team members received evaluation documentation for their signatures.
