

# Georgia Authorized Central Storage (ACS) Program Update



#### 3rd Quarter FY2022 (January 1 to March 31, 2022)

During the 3rd quarter, local and state law enforcement agencies used the Georgia ACS Program to store and dispose of hazardous waste from 2 clandestine drug labs. The processing and packaging materials resulted in 7 hazardous waste containers with a total volume of 235 gallons. The total weight of the hazardous waste was 347 pounds.

DEA has obtained congressional approval to allow expansion of the ACS Container Program to be utilized for waste related to Extraction Laboratory Operations and Milling Operations including DMT (dimethyltryptamine), THC (cannabis), MDMA (ecstasy), MDA, Fentanyl and Steroids. It should be noted in this reporting period a total of 4 Fentanyl pill presses were processed into the ACS Container Program.

The DEA Training Division and GBI hosted an ACS course at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center on March 8-10, 2022. Twenty-three local, state, and federal law enforcement officers attended the course.





# PLANS AND PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

#### **CUSTOMER RELATIONSHIP MANAGEMENT (CRM)**

**Project Description -** The CRM Application Project will provide a single source of historical interaction with external customers and will provide GCIC end users the ability to search, track and report customer interactions throughout business units.


**Monthly Update** - The project team is working on individual parts of the application that require special, detailed, attention and testing to incorporate into the final CRM database.


#### **CUSTOMER SUPPORT & TRAINING**

**Project Description -** The Customer Support Training group provides training in GCIC programs, GCIC applications, and GCIC/FBI compliance to criminal justice agencies across the State of Georgia. The group extends the option to receive classroom training or training within an e-Learning environment.

**Monthly Update -** Training Staff handled 1387 emails, 42 crystal reports and managed LMS user account additions. Multiple webinars and one-on-one trainings are being completed to meet State of Georgia training needs.







### **GEORGIA APPLICANT PROCESSING SERVICE (GAPS) PROJECT**

**Project Description -** The Information Services section of GCIC is seeking to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide an applicant fingerprinting solution that will electronically capture and submit applicant fingerprints to the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). The selected vendor shall also handle receiving fingerprint search results and disseminating results to the requestor.

**Monthly Update** - The current Applicant Print Service (APS) vendor will discontinue services. GBI met with the new third party vendor and provided follow-up questions. A virtual call was held with representatives from Thales, FieldPrint, DCH, GBI Legal, GBI Finance and State of Georgia representatives to deliver input regarding issues of concern with the current GAPS system.

## GEORGIA LAW ENFORCEMENT MESSAGE SWITCH (GLEMS)

**Project Description -** The message switch provides a means of communication between federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies throughout the state of Georgia, the United States, and other countries, and to take advantage of new features and advances in technology. GCIC is looking to upgrade or replace this system.

**Monthly Update** - The team meets weekly to review the project and troubleshooting meetings continue until development is completed for the GCIC interfaces. The vendor is working on testing completion and interface configuration.

# HUMAN RESOURCE (HR) TIMESHEET PROJECT

**Project Description** - Enhancement of the application used by non-sworn units of the GBI for tracking time.

**Monthly Update** - Application development is ongoing. The IT manager completed the bulk of application work and will work on HR requirements with the developer.

# RAP BACK PROJECT

**Project Description -** The Rap Back (RB) project will provide the ability to receive ongoing status notifications of criminal history activity reported on individuals holding positions of trust. Georgia's Rap Back System will include the retention of applicant fingerprints, the implementation of an FBI Rap Back Subscription on such prints, and the creation of a validation process for authorized entities to manage such subscriptions.

**Monthly Update** - The system is operating as designed. Thales gave notification to GCIC that they are leaving the Applicant Print Service (APS) Rap Back business and introduced the vendor that may acquire the GAPS/Rap Back service. GBI met with the new third party vendor and provided follow-up questions.

### SERVER REFRESH

**Project Description** - GBI is working in collaboration with GTA with the replacement, installation and configuration of several server hardware replacements and software installs.

**Monthly Update** - Work task items are being discussed and planned for migration to the development environment CCH database. The initial plan did not work because of the size and type of data. CCH migration of data will resume in April.
