The Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) is seeking qualified applicants to fill a Crime Laboratory Manager at the Southwestern Regional Laboratory located in Moultrie, Georgia.

Moultrie, the county seat of Colquitt County, is home to some of the most peaceful environments in the southeast. Located in Southwest Georgia, Moultrie, is:

- Within one hour of the Florida line
- 24 miles west of I-75, 66 miles north of Tallahassee, Florida, and about 200 miles south of Atlanta
- A short driving distance to the following Georgia cities:
  - Albany (38 miles northwest),
  - o Tifton (27 miles northeast),
  - o Thomasville (28 miles southwest) and;
  - Valdosta (45 miles southeast).

The successful applicant will join a system that encompasses a headquarters facility in Decatur, Georgia and six regional crime lab offices in Savannah, Augusta, Macon, Columbus, and Cleveland, which cumulatively serves all 159 counties in Georgia. The Southwestern Regional Crime Lab provides trace processing and forensic testing and analysis on DNA, serology and chemistry cases from agencies in 27 counties in southwest Georgia. This lab handles approximately 2400 to 2500 cases per year. In addition to the manager position, this lab is staffed with three (3) chemistry scientists, three (3) biology scientists, and three (3) laboratory technicians.

Each of the seven (7) GBI Crime Laboratories is accredited by the ASCLD/LAB-International program for the forensic analyses conducted in that facility. The Southwestern Regional Crime Lab has international accreditation in drug chemistry, serology, and DNA analysis. # **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

The Crime Lab Manager is responsible for performing the following duties and responsibilities:

- Manages the daily operations of a regional crime laboratory.
- Monitors laboratory work loads and services; recommends and/or implements improvements to minimize backlog and maximize efficiency.
- Performs analyses, interprets results, and conveys and presents laboratory information in a clear and concise manner.
- Protects the chain of custody on all evidence processed.
- Plans, coordinates and/or provides laboratory training.
- Manages human resources and directs administrative activities for laboratory employees.
- Interviews, hires, directs, trains, evaluates the performance of, and when necessary, disciplines laboratory employees.
- Maintains knowledge and skill in the latest methodology, techniques, proficiency testing, and instrumentation for the laboratory.
- Develops and conducts research projects which enhance overall quality of the assigned specialized section.
- Communicates with police, courts, media and public about status of operation or changes in policies and/or services provided, as necessary.

# **MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS**

Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in a related discipline AND six years of increasingly responsible crime laboratory experience, with one year of supervisory crime lab experience. (External Applicants)

#### OR

Two (2) years of experience as a Crime Lab Scientist (AL-1) OR At least one (1) year of experience as a Crime Lab Manager Level 1. (Internal Applicants)

## **SALARY AND BENEFITS**

# Georgia Bureau of Investigation Employment Disqualifiers (This list is not all inclusive)

Employment in law enforcement agencies involves public trust. Only those persons whose conduct, character and behavior which does not discredit either themselves or the Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) will be employed. The GBI employment process will address the integrity, ethical conduct, honesty, prejudices, financial responsibility (credit), and past behavior of all applicants. While the GBI reviews much information and considers the circumstances in many areas regarding an applicant's background, the following standards are among those that will automatically disqualify applicants from consideration:

- 1. Intentionally falsifying, misrepresenting, or omitting pertinent information while completing the employment application, preliminary interview questionnaires, polygraph or any other pre-employment document(s).
- 2. Deliberately making inaccurate, misleading, false, or fraudulent statements during the employment process.
- 3. Poor management of personal finances. (Debts, pending civil suits, garnishments, dispossessory warrants, bankruptcies, etc, will be investigated to determine a candidate's suitability for employment).
- 4. Personal state or federal tax liability or delinquent student or government loans unless the applicant is on an approved payment plan.
- 5. Failure to meet required educational or professional licensing or certification.
- 6. Any felony conviction.
- 7. Any outstanding criminal charge pending adjudication.
- 8. Sufficient misdemeanor convictions to establish a pattern of disregard for the law.
- 9. Admission to or discovery of an applicant's involvement in any crime of a serious or aggravated nature.
- 10. Any conviction or plea of *nolo* contendere within the past year for Driving Under the Influence of Drugs or Alcohol (DUI).
- 11. Any conviction or plea of *nolo* contendere for a serious traffic offense within the past two years including, but not limited to: Fleeing or Attempting to Elude a Police Officer, Vehicular Homicide (misdemeanor), Failure to Stop, Render Aid, or Leave Information, and Racing.
- 12. Five or more convictions and/or pleas of *nolo* contendere within the past two (2) years for any moving violations.
- 13. Ongoing criminal activity or history of criminal activity other than minor traffic offenses.
- 14. Completed first offender treatment for an offense that indicates a security risk to GBI facilities, records, and/or information.
- 15. Current illegal drug use.
- 16. Any pattern of marijuana use that suggests unrehabilitated substance abuse.
- 17. Any pattern of drug use, other than marijuana, that suggests unrehabilitated substance abuse.
- 18. Illegal sale, distribution or manufacturing (to include growing) of any drug.
- 19. Deliberate association of a personal nature within the past year with persons who use illegal drugs in the presence of the applicant.
- 20. Use or possession of marijuana during the last three years.
- 21. Use of an illegal drug or combination of illegal drugs, other than marijuana, during the past 10 years.
