Noteworthy Cases & Operational Support

• Region 4 – The GBI has identified the remains of a small girl found near Millwood, GA in Ware County on December 21, 1988, as Kenyatta "KeKe" Odom, of Albany, Dougherty County, GA. Kenyatta was 5 years old when she was found. On November 9, 2023, Evelyn Odom, A.K.A. Zmecca Luciana, age 56, and Ulyster Sanders, age 61, both of Albany, GA, were arrested and charged with felony murder, cruelty to children in the first degree, aggravated battery – family violence, concealing the death of another person, and conspiracy to conceal the death of another person.

On December 21, 1988, Ware County Sheriff's Office requested the GBI to assist with a death investigation involving a small girl found in the woods in a container encased in concrete. Evidence found led investigators to believe there could be a connection to the Albany area. A GBI medical examiner concluded the manner of death was homicide, but the cause of death could not be determined. Efforts made to identify the child included available forensic testing, collaboration with local social service organizations, local, state, and national media coverage, as well as comparisons to multiple missing children in several other states. None of these attempts led to her identification. In 2019, with the help of the Ware County Sheriff's Office, the GBI Crime Lab, as well as private labs, genealogy services determined a certain family tree from the Albany area was likely related to the child. In 2022, following a news story that aired on the anniversary of the child's death, police received a tip from a member of the public. Based on that tip, it was determined in early 2023 that the child was Kenyatta and that she died in Albany in 1988. Agents continued to investigate and determined that Ulyster was Evelyn's live-in boyfriend at the time of Kenyatta's death.

GBI agents presented the facts to the Dougherty County Grand Jury on November 1, 2023. The Grand Jury returned a True Bill. Police arrested Evelyn and Ulyster without incident on November 9, 2023. Once the investigation is completed, the case file will be given to the Dougherty Judicial Circuit District Attorney's Office for prosecution. The Waycross Judicial Circuit District Attorney's Office will also assist in prosecuting the case through a special arrangement. The GBI would like to thank the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC), National Missing and Unidentified Persons System (NamUs), University of North Texas, Gene by Gene, Othram, Inc., and Innovative Forensic Investigations for their assistance in identifying Kenyatta. The GBI would also like to thank a local, anonymous donor who provided a \$5,000 reward for information that would lead to the identification of the Ware Baby Jane Doe.

Region 2 – On November 13, 2023, the GBI was requested by Talbot County Sheriff's Office to investigate allegations of threats against Central High School in Talbot County. An unknown subject made an online social media post in which the subject made threats to shoot an unidentified student at Central High School. After several interviews, a 16-year-old subject was identified. The believed target of the threat was identified as the 16-year-old brother of a member of a local gang, the 4 Baby Gang. The gang member had previously been arrested for a retaliatory shooting against members of the Front Street Gang. An exigent request was sent to Instagram for information on the online account and the IP address and phone number on the account was linked to the 16-year-old subject's mother. The subject's mother advised that her son would be obtaining an attorney, and the attorney would contact the case agent for an interview. The 16-year-old subject was charged and arrested for Terroristic Threats and Acts (Felony). The Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency was also informed of the online post/threat. The 16-year-old subject turned himself into the Talbot County Sheriff's Office on November 24, 2023, and had a preliminary hearing in Juvenile Court on November 28, 2023. The trial has been scheduled.

- Office of Special Investigations (OSI) Cold Case Unit (CCU) The Coleman-Baker Act (CBA) request webform has been on the GBI website Home page since June 30, 2023. Nineteen (19) cold cases are being reviewed at this time. Six (6) were requests from designated family members and thirteen (13) were self-initiated.
- From January 1 to November 30, 2023, the GBI has investigated a total of 94 Officer Involved Shootings (OIS). OIS number 94 was on November 28, 2023. GBI's Region 10 office was requested by South Fulton Police Department for an OIS. South Fulton PD officers responded to a 911 call for a sexual assault complaint. The victim reported that a man, later identified as Fred Claud Perkins, age 78, of Riverdale, GA, shot at her and hit her with his gun. When officers arrived on scene, they gathered information on the incident and Perkin's possible location. As officers approached a shed on the property, they found Perkins. Perkins was armed with a shotgun and shot at officers. Officers returned fire and Perkins retreated into the shed. Later, officers found Perkins dead inside the building. Police found a shotgun with Perkins. The GBI will conduct an independent investigation. Once complete, the case file will be given to the Fulton County District Attorney's Office for review.



Investigative Hours Expended - YTD FY2024





GEORGIA APPLICANT PROCESSING SERVICE (GAPS) PROJECT

Project Description - The Information Services section of GCIC is seeking to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide an applicant fingerprinting solution that will electronically capture and submit applicant fingerprints to the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) and provide Rap Back services. The selected vendor shall also handle receiving fingerprint search results and disseminating results to the requestor.

Monthly Update - GAPS is operational. Weekly project calls continue between GBI and Fieldprint regarding change order requests. One change order from October remains unresolved.

GEORGIA LAW ENFORCEMENT MESSAGE SWITCH (GLEMS)

Project Description - The message switch provides a means of communication between federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies throughout the state of Georgia, the United States, and other countries, and to take advantage of new features and advances in technology. GCIC is looking to upgrade or replace this system.

Monthly Update - GCIC continues to work with Datamaxx and other SOG Stakeholders to test production connections and prepare for a 2024 first quarter deployment.

HUMAN RESOURCE (HR) TIMESHEET PROJECT

Project Description - Enhancement of the application used by non-sworn units of the GBI for tracking time.

Monthly Update - The developer is working to add the signature function to the Timecard application. The PM is awaiting feedback from the sponsor concerning next steps.

NATIONAL SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY (NSOR) NOTIFICATION PROJECT

Project Description - The NSOR project will provide Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) the ability to receive NSOR responses as a part of the criminal history background check, in compliance with Federal, state, and local laws to make complete/accurate fitness determinations.

Monthly Update - The NSOR project is moving forward. The MOU was completed and the GTA-DECAL-GBI SOW is being reviewed.

RAP BACK PROJECT

Project Description - The Rap Back (RB) project will provide the ability to receive ongoing status notifications of criminal history activity reported on individuals holding positions of trust. Georgia's Rap Back System will include the retention of applicant fingerprints, the implementation of an FBI Rap Back Subscription on such prints, and the creation of a validation process for authorized entities to manage such subscriptions. The Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) is requesting proposals for the Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) with the Federal Rap Back Subscription Service. The objective of this procurement is to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide real-time, end -to-end, on-line submission of fingerprint images and data, designed to ensure high performance combined with high availability and reliability to the GBI Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS).

Monthly Update - The Notice of Award was published on the DOAS Purchasing site. A brief introduction call was held with the new vendor's staff working on the project. The kickoff meeting is tentatively scheduled December 5-7, 2023.
