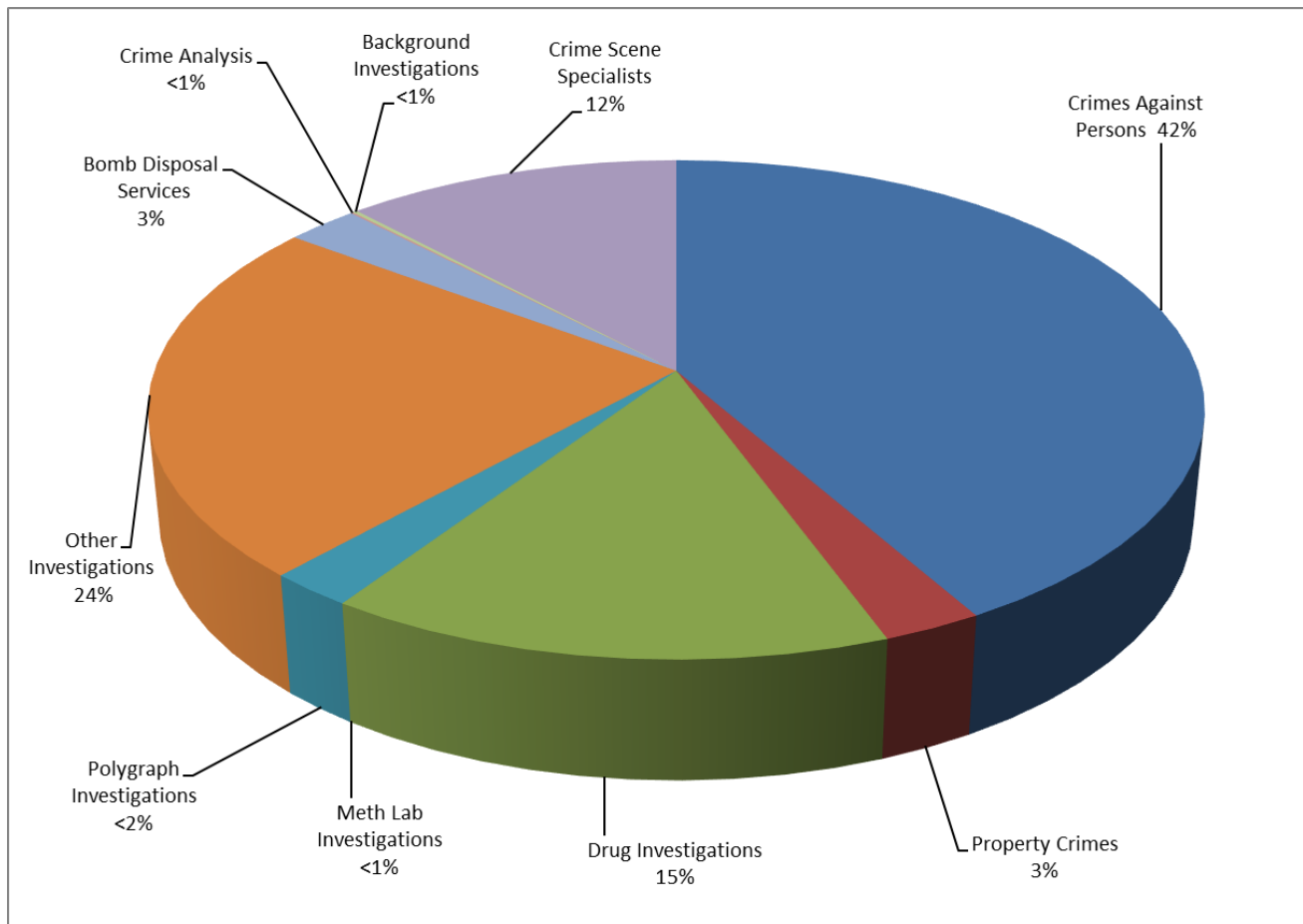

## **Georgia Authorized Central Storage (ACS) Program Update**

2nd Quarter FY2022 (October 1 to December 31, 2021)

During the 2nd quarter, local and state law enforcement agencies used the Georgia ACS program to store and dispose of hazardous waste from 2 clandestine drug labs. The processing and packaging materials resulted in 5 hazardous waste containers with a total volume of 25 gallons. The total weight of the hazardous waste was 31 pounds.

The DEA Training Division and GBI have scheduled an ACS course at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center for March 8-10, 2022. Twenty-four local and state law enforcement officers have signed up to take this training.

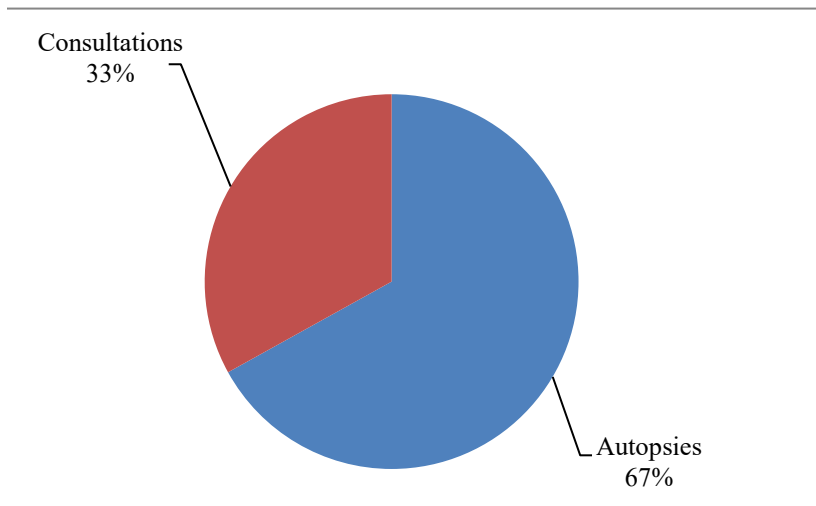

### CUSTOMER RELATIONSHIP MANAGEMENT (CRM)

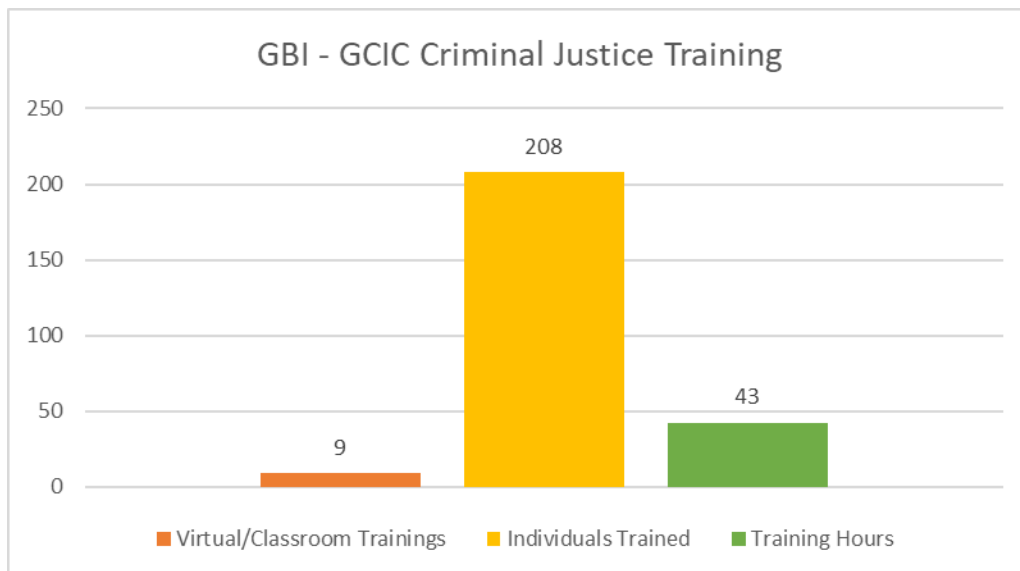
**Project Description** - The CRM Application Project will provide a single source of historical interaction with external customers and will provide GCIC end users the ability to search, track and report customer interactions throughout business units.

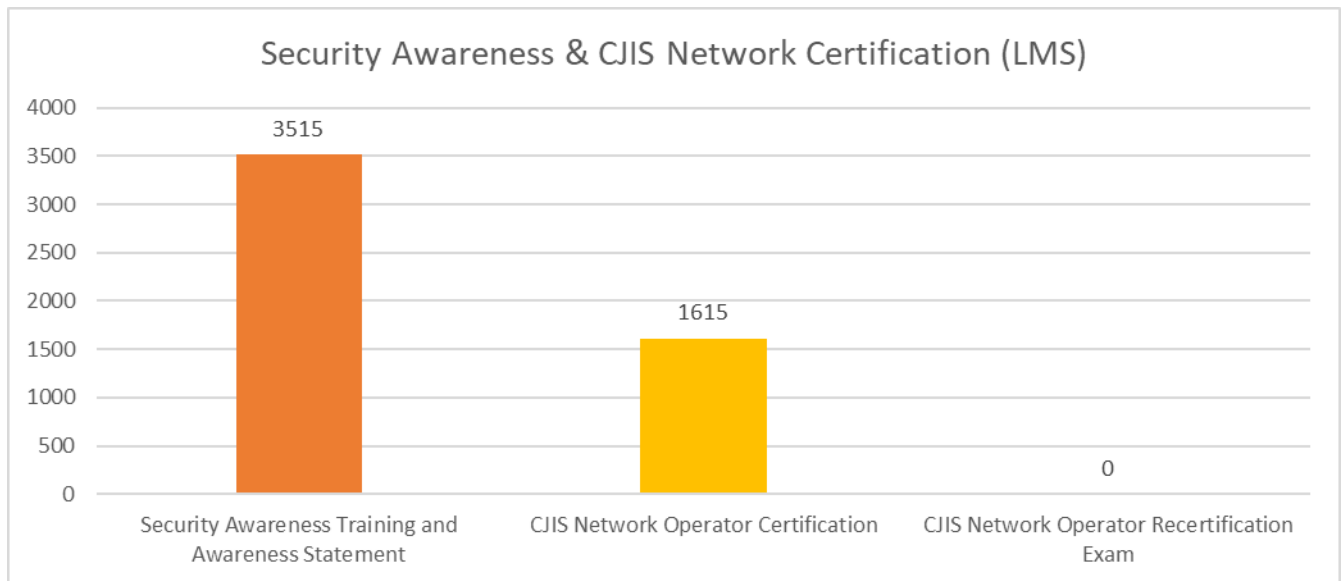
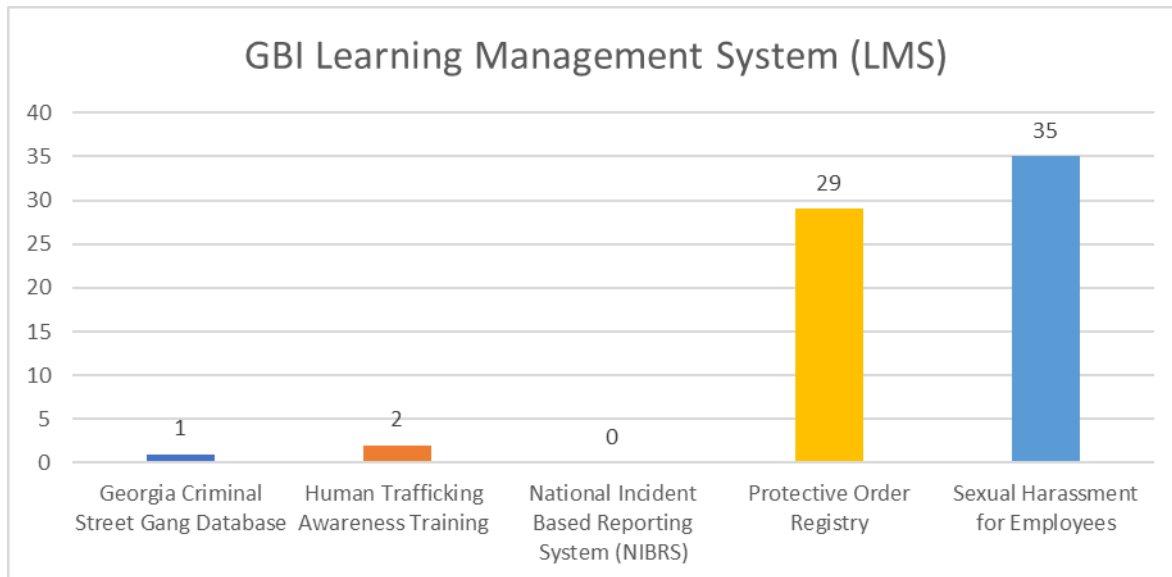
**Monthly Update** - There are no updates this month.

### CUSTOMER SUPPORT & TRAINING

**Project Description** - The Customer Support Training group provides training in GCIC programs, GCIC applications, and GCIC/FBI compliance to criminal justice agencies across the State of Georgia. The group extends the option to receive classroom training or training within an e-Learning environment.

**Monthly Update** - The Training Staff handled 1185 emails, 26 crystal reports and managed LMS user account additions. Multiple webinars and one-on-one trainings are being completed to meet State of Georgia training needs.





### **GEORGIA APPLICANT PROCESSING SERVICE (GAPS) PROJECT**

**Project Description** - The Information Services section of GCIC is seeking to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide an applicant fingerprinting solution that will electronically capture and submit applicant fingerprints to the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). The selected vendor shall also handle receiving fingerprint search results and disseminating results to the requestor.

**Monthly Update** - There are no updates this month.



## **GEORGIA LAW ENFORCEMENT MESSAGE SWITCH (GLEMS)**

**Project Description** - The message switch provides a means of communication between federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies throughout the state of Georgia, the United States, and other countries, and to take advantage of new features and advances in technology. GCIC is looking to upgrade or replace this system.

**Monthly Update** - The team meets weekly to review the project and discovery meetings continue. Development is completed for the GCIC interfaces and configuration for the interfaces are taking place (AIX, SOR, GDC, DDS/DOR and CCH). The team has decided to postpone a cloud solution.

## **HUMAN RESOURCE (HR) TIMESHEET PROJECT**

**Project Description** - Enhancement of the application used by non-sworn units of the GBI for tracking time.

**Monthly Update** - Application development is ongoing.

## **RAP BACK PROJECT**

**Project Description** - The Rap Back (RB) project will provide the ability to receive ongoing status notifications of criminal history activity reported on individuals holding positions of trust. Georgia's Rap Back System will include the retention of applicant fingerprints, the implementation of an FBI Rap Back Subscription on such prints, and the creation of a validation process for authorized entities to manage such subscriptions.

**Monthly Update** - NEC and Thales continue to work together to troubleshoot issues. Thales is working with the Department of Community Health (DCH) on prenotifications, working on a fix for multiple rejects due to the LSTCN character field, and a workflow document for GBI. GCIC Team continues to troubleshoot issues with Thales and DCH to ensure the RB system works properly.

## **SERVER REFRESH**

**Project Description** - GBI is working in collaboration with GTA with the replacement, installation and configuration of several server hardware replacements and software installs.

**Monthly Update** - Work task items are being discussed and completed for migration to the new CCH servers. GBI is working with GTA/Unisys on data migration to development and a January move by GTA/Unisys is planned.
