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## Noteworthy Cases & Operational Support

- Region 8 – Cleveland Field Office – On January 9, 2024, the GBI arrested and charged Brandon Scott Hicks, age 37, of Mineral Bluff, GA, and Breanna Micaela Rodriguez, age 28, of Andrews, NC, with felony murder, possession of a controlled substance with the intent to distribute and possession of a controlled substance, in Fannin County, GA.

On December 12, 2023, the Fannin County Sheriff's Office requested the GBI to investigate the death of Joshua Darrin Hughes, age 41, of Blue Ridge, GA. Hughes was an inmate at the Fannin County Detention Center and was found unresponsive at the detention center on December 12, 2023. Hughes was taken to Fannin Regional Hospital where he was pronounced dead. He was then taken to the GBI Crime Lab for an autopsy. Preliminary information from the autopsy and the investigation revealed that Hughes died of a fentanyl overdose. During the investigation, GBI agents discovered that Rodriguez brought fentanyl into the detention center and provided fentanyl to Hicks, while both were inmates at the detention center. The investigation further indicated that Hicks provided the fentanyl to Hughes before Hughes was found unconscious at the detention center. Hicks and Rodriguez remain in custody at the Fannin County Detention Center. When the investigation is complete, it will be given to the Fannin County District Attorney's Office for prosecution.

- Southwestern Regional Drug Enforcement Office (SWRDEO) – The GBI, the Albany Dougherty County Drug Unit (ADDU), the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms (ATF) conducted a joint investigation into a conspiracy to traffic drugs and firearms throughout Albany, GA, resulting in the arrest of ten individuals. Charges included conspiracy to traffic methamphetamine; trafficking in cocaine, illegal drugs, marijuana, or methamphetamine; possession of a firearm during the commission of certain crimes; and possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Two additional people are wanted with active arrest warrants in this investigation. On December 7, 2023, the GBI, DEA, Georgia State Patrol, Lee County Sheriff's Office, Colquitt County Sheriff's Office, and ADDU executed search warrants on North Slappey Boulevard, Albany, Dougherty County, GA. Police executed several arrest warrants throughout Albany, GA. During this 6-month joint investigation, 27 firearms, including shotguns, handguns, and rifles were seized, several of the firearms were fully automatic weapons. Over 1,830 grams of suspected methamphetamine, 2.3 grams of suspected heroin, and numerous suspected oxycodone pills were seized.
- Southwestern Regional Drug Enforcement Office (SWRDEO) – The GBI arrested and charged Juan Antonious Boone, age 35, of Americus, GA, following a joint, month-long drug investigation by the GBI SWRDEO and the Americus Police Department (PD). On January 8, 2024, Boone was charged with probation violation, two counts of theft by receiving stolen property, three counts of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, three counts of possession of a firearm during the commission of a felony, two counts of trafficking cocaine, one count of trafficking methamphetamine, obstruction, and aggravated assault against a police officer. Americus PD officers conducted a traffic stop on Boone to arrest him for an outstanding warrant. During the traffic stop, Boone initially tried to drive away to avoid arrest, but was successfully apprehended. Police recovered a little less than 3,000 grams of suspected marijuana, 120 grams of suspected methamphetamine, 165 grams of suspected crack cocaine, 200 grams of suspected powder cocaine, 2 grams of suspected fentanyl, 3 handguns, and over \$12,400. Boone was booked at the Sumter County Jail.

- Human Exploitation and Trafficking (HEAT) Unit – January 24-26, 2024, the GBI, Bryan County Sheriff’s Office, Richmond Hill Police Department, and the Georgia Department of Public Safety’s Motor Carrier Compliance Division conducted “Operation Not for Sale,” a proactive operation targeting sex traffickers and sex buyers in the Bryan County area. The operation resulted in 10 potential human trafficking victims being contacted and offered advocate, shelter, and medical services. Fourteen arrests were made for pandering, and three arrests for pimping. Additional charges and arrests may follow. The arrestees, ranging in age from 21 to 49, traveled from areas around Bryan County, GA with the intent to purchase sex or sell sex. The goal of “Operation Not for Sale” was to draw in sex buyers for demand reduction and draw in sex workers to offer services. The objective was to identify and arrest pimps and human traffickers through this two-fold approach. The Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) also assisted in providing resources to the victims.
- Office of Special Investigations (OSI) - Cold Case Unit (CCU) – The Coleman-Baker Act (CBA) request webform has been on the GBI website Home page since June 30, 2023. Twenty-three (23) cold cases are being reviewed at this time. Seven (7) were requests from designated family members and sixteen (16) were self-initiated.
- From January 1 to January 31, 2024, the GBI investigated a total of five (5) Officer Involved Shootings (OIS). OIS number five (5) was on January 30, 2024. GBI’s Region 10 – Atlanta Regional Field Office was requested by Cobb County Police Department (PD). Cobb County 911 began receiving calls of a person firing shots in a residential area. Officers responded to Columns Drive in Marietta and located Thomas Yarborough, age 83, of Marietta, GA, outside the front door of a home. Yarborough was armed with a handgun. Officers gave Yarborough commands to drop the gun, but Yarborough fired the gun. Officers returned fire, hitting Yarborough. Yarborough received medical aid and was taken to a local hospital for treatment where he is in critical condition. The GBI will conduct an independent investigation. Once complete, the case file will be given to the Cobb County District Attorney’s Office for review.

## **Trainings and Projects**

### **Legal Division**

- GBI’s Senior Managing Attorney and Special Prosecutor attended the 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Savannah Traffick Jam, “Fight for Freedom: United Against Human Trafficking,” held January 26-27, 2024, giving a presentation on GBI’s Georgia Criminal Street Gang Database, and working a booth at the Public Safety and Public Service Job Fair.

### **Division of Forensic Sciences**

- On January 5, 2024, an Associate Medical Examiner and two Medical Examiner Fellows gave a presentation to Banks County High School forensic students, discussing what a medical examiner is, what they do, and why they're so needed. 11Alive News covered the presentation.

## **Personnel Matters**

- Three additional Division of Forensic Sciences Toxicology Crime Lab Scientists and one Firearms Crime Lab Scientist began full-time employment in January 2024.
- One additional Georgia Crime Information Center Criminal Justice Information Specialist began full-time employment in January 2024.
- On January 31, 2024, Special Agent in Charge Jason Seacrist and Assistant Special Agent in Charge Richard Dial received the William French Smith Award for Outstanding Contributions to Cooperative Law Enforcement from Attorney General Merrick B. Garland for their work in the investigation into Ahmaud Arbery's murder in 2020. This award recognizes state and local law enforcement officials who have made significant contributions to cooperative law enforcement endeavors.

- Catherine Jordan was promoted to the Division of Forensic Sciences Central Regional Crime Lab Assistant Manager, effective January 16, 2024.

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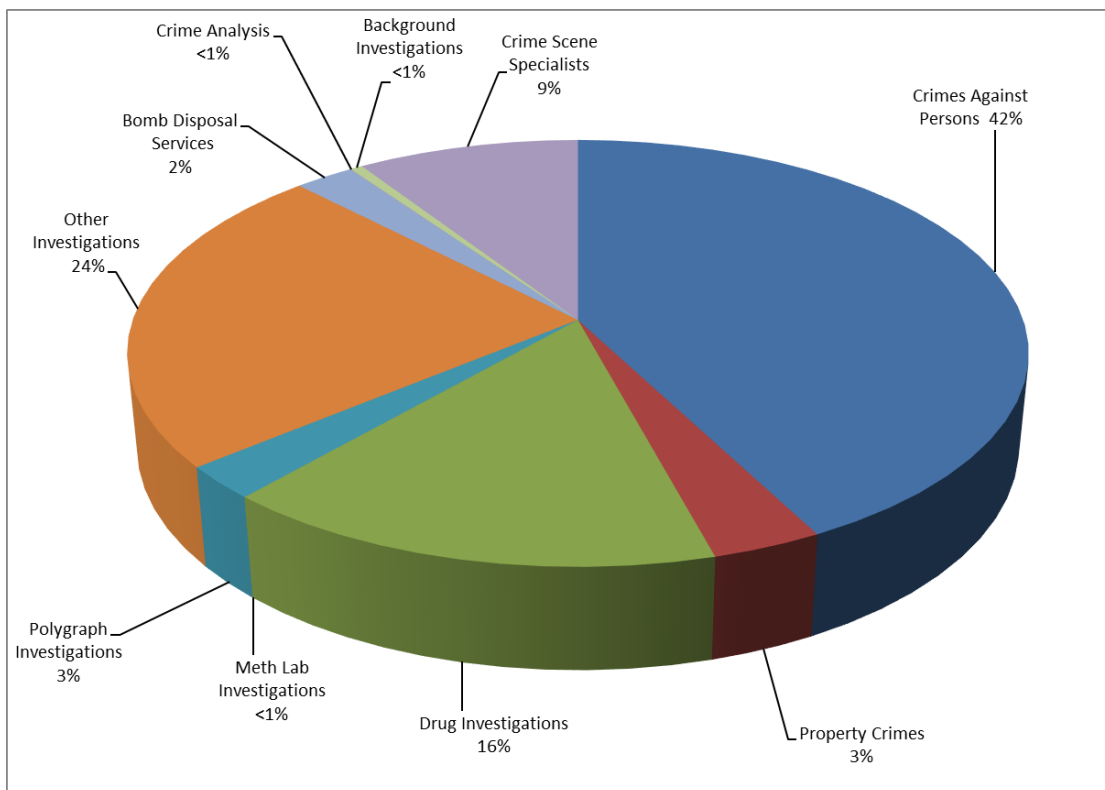

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### Investigative Hours Expended - YTD FY2024



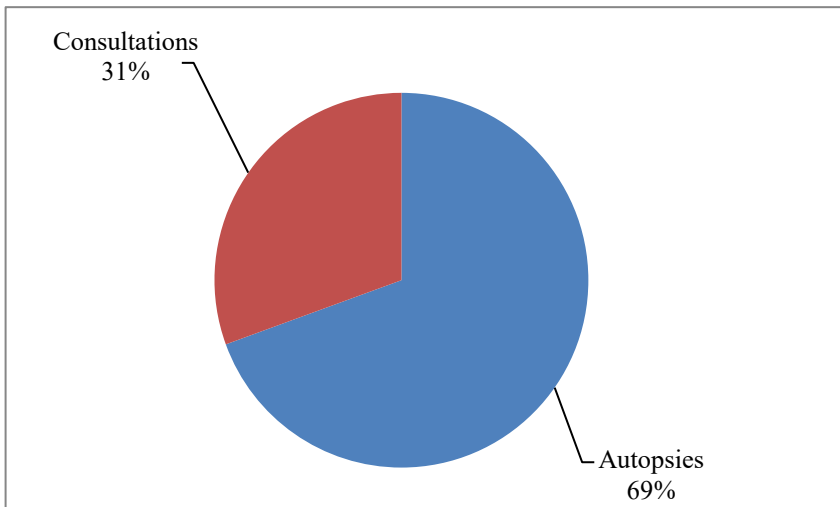

## PLANS AND PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

### AUTOMATED FINGERPRINT IDENTIFICATION SYSTEM (AFIS)

**Project Description** - The Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) requires upgrade of its current Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). The Georgia AFIS utilizes biometric identification technology to obtain, store, and analyze arrest fingerprints, palmprints, latent prints, civil fingerprints, and mugshots to provide criminal identification and arrest information to criminal justice and employment/licensing agencies both in Georgia and nationwide. Georgia and Federal law require the GCIC and specifically AFIS to be operational. At this point in time, the Georgia AFIS is unsupported and no longer receiving software patches or security updates. Therefore, GBI must upgrade the current AFIS for the Lifecycles of all the GBI AFIS hardware have exceeded end-of-service-life (ESOL)status.

**Monthly Update** - Weekly calls are scheduled to discuss the project plan, business requirements, connectivity, and interface requirements. Also, calls are arranged with external vendors that connect to AFIS (CCH, SORT, GAPS, Finance, Rapid-ID, Live Scan) to discuss changes that will be forthcoming with the new Multimodal Biometric Identification System (MBIS).

### CUSTOMER SUPPORT & TRAINING

**Project Description** - The Customer Support Training group provides training in GCIC programs, GCIC applications, and GCIC/FBI compliance to criminal justice agencies across the State of Georgia.

## **GEORGIA APPLICANT PROCESSING SERVICE (GAPS) PROJECT**

**Project Description** - The Information Services section of GCIC is seeking to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide an applicant fingerprinting solution that will electronically capture and submit applicant fingerprints to the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) and provide Rap Back services. The selected vendor shall also handle receiving fingerprint search results and disseminating results to the requestor.

**Monthly Update** - GAPS/Rap Back is operational; however, biweekly project calls continue between GBI and Fieldprint regarding maintenance requests.

## **GEORGIA LAW ENFORCEMENT MESSAGE SWITCH (GLEMS)**

**Project Description** - The message switch provides a means of communication between federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies throughout the state of Georgia, the United States, and other countries, and to take advantage of new features and advances in technology. GCIC is looking to upgrade or replace this system.

**Monthly Update** - GCIC continues to work on GLEMS training.

## **NATIONAL SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY (NSOR) NOTIFICATION PROJECT**

**Project Description** - The NSOR project will provide Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) the ability to receive NSOR responses as a part of the criminal history background check, in compliance with Federal, state, and local laws to make complete/accurate fitness determinations.

**Monthly Update** - The NSOR project is moving forward. The MOU was completed and the GTA-DECAL-GBI SOW was signed by the GCIC Director.

## **RAP BACK PROJECT**

**Project Description** - The Rap Back (RB) project will provide the ability to receive ongoing status notifications of criminal history activity reported on individuals holding positions of trust. Georgia's Rap Back System will include the retention of applicant fingerprints, the implementation of an FBI Rap Back Subscription on such prints, and the creation of a validation process for authorized entities to manage such subscriptions. The Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) is requesting proposals for the Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) with the Federal Rap Back Subscription Service. The objective of this procurement is to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide real-time, end -to-end, on-line submission of fingerprint images and data, designed to ensure high performance combined with high availability and reliability to the GBI Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS).

**Monthly Update** - The GAPS kick-off meeting was held with Idemia.
