 Child Exploitation and Computer Crimes (CEACC) Unit – In December 2024, as part of ongoing efforts to identify those involved in the trade of child sexual abuse material, GBI's CEACC Unit arrested and charged the following:

On December 18, 2024, Harold Ryan, age 42, of Thomson, McDuffie County, Georgia, was arrested and charged with four counts of Sexual Exploitation of Children. An investigation into Ryan's illicit online activity began in September 2024 after receiving numerous CyberTips from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) involving possession of child sexual abuse material. The investigation led to a search warrant at Ryan's home and his subsequent arrest. The Thomson Police Department aided the GBI CEACC unit in the execution of this search warrant. Ryan was booked into the McDuffie County Jail.

On December 11, 2024, Wesley Eugene Covenah, age 40, of Townsend, McIntosh County, Georgia, was arrested and charged with Sexual Exploitation of Children. GBI's CEACC Unit began an investigation into Covenah's online activity in September 2024, after receiving a Cyber Tipline Report from NCMEC regarding the possible online possession and distribution of child sexual abuse material. This investigation led to a search warrant for Covenah's home and his subsequent arrest. The McIntosh County Sheriff's Office assisted with the search warrant and arrest. Covenah was booked into the McIntosh County Jail.

On December 11, 2024, Ronald Melton, age 43, of Lithonia, DeKalb County, Georgia, was arrested and charged with Sexual Exploitation of Children. GBI's CEACC Unit began an investigation into Melton's online activity in February 2024, after receiving a Cyber Tipline Report from NCMEC regarding the possible online possession and distribution of child sexual abuse material. This investigation led to a search warrant for Melton's home and his subsequent arrest. The DeKalb County Police Department assisted with the search warrant and arrest. Melton was booked into the DeKalb County Jail.

• Region 14 – Camden County Cold Case – On December 9, 2024, the GBI arrested and charged Erik Kristensen Sparre, age 61, of Waynesville, GA, with two counts of murder and two counts of aggravated assault in the 1985 deaths of Harold and Thelma Swain. Sparre was arrested in Waynesville, Brantley County, GA without incident. Sparre was booked into the Camden County Jail.

In 1985, Harold and Thelma Swain were shot to death while at the Rising Daughter Baptist Church in Woodbine, Georgia. In 2003, nearly twenty years later, Dennis Perry was convicted of the murders. On May 13, 2020, the GBI and the Camden County Sheriff's Office reopened the death investigation because of possible new evidence. In 2021, Perry was exonerated due to DNA evidence. In December 2024, after conducting numerous investigative acts, the case was presented to the Brunswick Judicial Circuit District Attorney's Office regarding Sparre's involvement in the Swain's deaths. Sparre was arrested and indicted in this case.

- Appalachian Regional Drug Enforcement Office (ARDEO) GBI's ARDEO arrested and charged Kevin Wayne Oliver, age 43, of Dahlonega, GA, with Trafficking Methamphetamine and Possession of Marijuana with Intent to Distribute. On December 6, 2024, Oliver was arrested at a home in Dahlonega, GA, for a Probation Violation warrant. During a subsequent search of his property, law enforcement found and seized more than 150 grams of suspected methamphetamine and approximately six ounces of suspected marijuana. Oliver was booked into the Lumpkin County Detention Center. The Lumpkin County Sheriff's Office and the GBI ARDEO participated in this investigation.
- Office of Special Investigations (OSI) Cold Case Unit (CCU) The Coleman-Baker Act (CBA) request webform has been on the GBI website Home page since June 30, 2023. Thirty-eight (38) cold cases are being reviewed or reinvestigated at this time. Fifteen (15) were requests from designated family members and twenty-three (23) were GBI initiated. CCU has also opened twelve (12) GBI cold case unidentified remains (UID) cases in hopes of identifying the victims with FIGG (Forensic Investigative Genetic Genealogy).
- From January 1 to December 31, 2024, the GBI investigated a total of eighty-five (85) Officer Involved • Shootings (OIS). GBI's Region 2 – Midland, GA Field Office was requested by Georgia State Patrol (GSP) in reference to an OIS in Grantville, Coweta County, GA. On December 18, 2024, a GSP Trooper initiated a traffic stop on a Chevrolet Cruze traveling southbound on Interstate 85 (I-85). The driver, Ira Troy Williams, age 51, provided his driver's license to the Trooper conducting the traffic stop. Williams then drove away from the scene, traveling southbound on I-85, resulting in a vehicle pursuit by GSP. During the pursuit, Williams fired a weapon several times from his car at Troopers and Coweta County Deputies who joined the chase. The Troopers returned gunfire. Troopers performed several PIT maneuvers to disable the Chevrolet Cruze. The car chase ended in Grantville. Williams got out of his car and again fired his weapon several times at the Troopers while running away. On December 19, 2024, arrest warrants were issued for Williams for Aggravated Assault against a Police Officer for shooting at Troopers during the car chase. Williams was on the run until he was taken into custody without further incident on December 20, 2024, by GSP and the Coweta County Sheriff's Office. One GSP K-9 Officer was shot. The K-9 Officer was treated and released from a veterinary hospital. No other officers were injured during the incident.


GBI Attains 9th Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc. (CALEA) Accreditation

Investigative Cases – YTD FY2025







MEO Backlog - FY2025


