Noteworthy Cases & Operational Support

- Region 10 Updates for the Trooper Officer Involved Shooting from January 18th On Wednesday, June 7, 2023, a subject (Kenneth Michael Horn) was arrested by a Trooper on outstanding warrants from Carroll County stemming from him being involved with distributing flyers in a neighborhood of a law enforcement officer involved in the Cop City OIS. During the stop, the subject tossed his cell phone to his girlfriend and asked her to erase it. The Trooper seized the phone before it could be erased. The girlfriend was also arrested for Obstructing an Officer. Agents attempted to interview the subjects, but both requested attorneys. Their phones will be forensically examined via search warrants.
- Region 10 Update for the APD Public Safety Training Center/DTAF On Tuesday, June 6, 2023, at approximately 5 a.m., after 16 hours of comments by over 300 members of the public, the Atlanta City Council voted to fund the APD training center. Since that time, the DTAF/Stop Cop City has scheduled a week of action for June 24, 2023 through July 1, 2023.
- Region 7 The GBI arrested and charged Cordell John Henry Cobb, 22, of Midville, GA, with Armed Robbery, Aggravated Assault, and Possession of a Firearm During the Commission of a Crime. The investigation began on June 14, 2023, when the Glascock County Sheriff's Office asked the GBI to investigate an armed robbery that happened at the Gibson Mini Mart in Gibson, Georgia. The investigation shows that Cobb entered the Mini-Mart and took an undisclosed amount of money during the incident. On June 16, 2023, the Burke County Sheriff's Office Special Response Team executed a search warrant in the 9000 block of Highway 56 in Midville relating to the investigation. Cobb, along with James R. Davis, 27, of Midville, were taken into custody by Burke County deputies and GBI agents. Cobb was taken to the McDuffie County Jail, where he is currently being held on charges relating to the Gibson Mini-Mart robbery. Davis was being held at the Burke County Sheriff's Office for the Waycross Police Department for an armed robbery that took place in their jurisdiction but has since been moved to the Ware County Sheriff's Office. Cobb and Davis are suspects in at least fourteen robberies that have occurred across the state in the last several months, including Bulloch, Chatham, Emmanuel, Jenkins, Tift, Ware, and Washington Counties.
- From January 1 to June 30, 2023, the GBI has investigated a total of 47 Officer Involved Shootings (OIS). OIS number 47 was on June 25, 2023. Region 13 responded to a request for assistance from the Warner Robins Police Department in reference to an officer involved shooting involving two officers and one suspect (Todd Eric Jones). The incident began as a drive by shooting investigation. Officers were able to locate the involved vehicle and suspect based on information provided to them by witnesses. The officers attempted to stop the vehicle, but the suspect sped away. The suspect crashed his vehicle while trying to elude the officers. The suspect shot at the officers, who then shot at the suspect. The suspect then exited his vehicle and ran down the street where he carjacked a driver/vehicle. The victim jumped out of the vehicle, and the suspect fled the scene in the stolen vehicle. Later, officers located the suspect in a vehicle, and he was threatening to shoot himself. A standoff began and officers attempted to get the suspect to surrender. At approximately midnight, the suspect was taken into custody without further incident. The suspect had at least one gunshot wound to his shoulder/arm. No officers were injured during the incident.

Legal Division

- Agricultural Labor Trafficking Special Prosecutor Diane McLeod conducted Human Trafficking Training for the Georgia Department of Agriculture on June 6, 2023 in Atlanta, GA and on June 8, 2023 at the Georgia Public Safety Training Center in Forsyth, GA.
- Senior Managing Attorney Lindsay Gardner conducted GBI Gang Database Training in Statesboro, GA on June 29, 2023.

Division of Forensic Sciences

- The GBI Medical Examiner's Office (MEO) held a graduation ceremony for the 2022-2023 GBI Forensic Pathology Fellows, Dr. Romana Mayer and Dr. Samantha Mattox, on June 29, 2023.
- The MEO's new Forensic Pathology Fellows, Dr. Kari Broder and Dr. Taylor Sliker, began their fellowship on July 3, 2023.
- The Division of Forensic Sciences (DOFS) held their 2023 Virtual Symposium on June 14, 2023.

Georgia Crime Information Center

- New Georgia Laws effective July 1st GCIC Legislative Impacts:
 - O Mariam's Law (HB 188) Georgia Dangerous Sexual Predator Prevention Act. The law requires sex offenders who have not received a risk-level assessment to be fitted with an ankle monitor. Once they are leveled, the most dangerous offenders have to wear the monitor for the duration of their probation, while lower-level offenders could have them removed if the state Department of Community Supervision approves.
 - GCIC has made the name change "Sexual Offender Risk Review Board" to all related documents.
 - SB60 Changes to Required Information from Secondary Metals Recyclers. The GCIC Team has worked closely with the Metal Recycler Association, GSA, the Metal Recycler vendor (LeadsOnline) and others about the changes. GCIC has created an Operations Bulletin for notification to law enforcement as well as posting the Operations Bulletin on the GBI and GCIC websites.

- SB272 passed this year which transferred oversight of the Criminal Case Data Exchange Board (CDX) related to SB441 to the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC). GCIC serves as the point of contact and participates in the subcommittee meetings with AOC.
- The GCIC Team is reviewing all recently passed legislation to determine if any new felony and/or misdemeanor charges should be created.
- The GCIC Team will conduct an onsite Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) Fieldprint audit in mid-July.
- An Operations Bulletin has been created to notify Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) Users about the price change from \$8.25 to \$9.75 (18% increase) with an effective date of September 1, 2023.

Investigative Division

• Twenty Special Agents began employment on June 16, 2023. Five additional Special Agents began employment on July 3, 2023.



Investigative Hours Expended - YTD FY2023





GEORGIA APPLICANT PROCESSING SERVICE (GAPS) PROJECT

Project Description - The Information Services section of GCIC is seeking to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide an applicant fingerprinting solution that will electronically capture and submit applicant fingerprints to the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) and provide Rap Back services. The selected vendor shall also handle receiving fingerprint search results and disseminating results to the requestor.

Monthly Update - The FieldPrint Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) became operational on May 1, 2023, and GBI continues weekly project calls with FieldPrint. A weekly call was also established for GBI, FieldPrint and state agencies to discuss user issues that have developed since May 1. The GBI received approval to extend its contract with Fieldprint for the Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) for one year until 06/30/2024. The DOAS posted the GAPS RFP on May 24, 2023.

GEORGIA LAW ENFORCEMENT MESSAGE SWITCH (GLEMS)

Project Description - The message switch provides a means of communication between federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies throughout the state of Georgia, the United States, and other countries, and to take advantage of new features and advances in technology. GCIC is looking to upgrade or replace this system.

Monthly Update - GCIC continues to work with Datamaxx and other SOG Stakeholders to test the connections and prepare the production environment for go-live. The new GLEMS vendor is Datamaxx, and web-based training is available to all users. Please visit the GCIC website, under the Georgia Law Enforcement Message Switch (GLEMS) is a link to sign-up for the trainings. Users can choose from a variety of courses/available times. All users that participate must fill out the members request, by choosing a class or "members only" button, the user will be prompted to register for each class.

HUMAN RESOURCE (HR) TIMESHEET PROJECT

Project Description - Enhancement of the application used by non-sworn units of the GBI for tracking time.

Monthly Update - The developer is awaiting feedback from Human Resources for additional updates.

NATIONAL SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY (NSOR) NOTIFICATION PROJECT

Project Description - The NSOR project will provide Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning (DECAL) the ability to receive NSOR responses as a part of the criminal history background check, in compliance with Federal, state, and local laws to make complete/accurate fitness determinations.

Monthly Update - There are no updates this reporting period.

RAP BACK PROJECT

Project Description - The Rap Back (RB) project will provide the ability to receive ongoing status notifications of criminal history activity reported on individuals holding positions of trust. Georgia's Rap Back System will include the retention of applicant fingerprints, the implementation of an FBI Rap Back Subscription on such prints, and the creation of a validation process for authorized entities to manage such subscriptions. The Georgia Bureau of Investigation (GBI) is requesting proposals for the Georgia Applicant Processing Service (GAPS) with the Federal Rap Back Subscription Service. The objective of this procurement is to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide real-time, end -to-end, on-line submission of fingerprint images and data, designed to ensure high performance combined with high availability and reliability to the GBI Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS).

Monthly Update - GTA approved the eRFP for bid release and the release date was 5/24/2023 with a 31-day closing for all bids to be received by GTA.
