Director's Highlights

- Southwestern Regional Drug Enforcement Office (SRDEO) On September 24, 2024, the GBI, Albany Dougherty County Drug Unit (ADDU), Seminole County Sheriff's Office (SO), Camilla Police Department, Mitchell County SO, Thomas County SO, and Miller County SO executed arrest warrants throughout numerous Georgia counties. Eighteen arrests were made in this joint investigation into a conspiracy to traffic drugs throughout multiple counties in Southwest Georgia. Charges include Conspiracy to Possess Methamphetamine with the Intent to Distribute; Possession of Methamphetamine with Intent to Distribute; Conspiracy to Traffic Methamphetamine; Trafficking Methamphetamine; Use of a Communication Facility in Commission of a Felony Involving Methamphetamine; Possession of a Schedule III, IV, or V Controlled Substance with Intent to Distribute; Use of a Communication Facility in Commission of a Felony Involving Controlled Substances; Conspiracy to Traffic Methamphetamine, Marijuana, and other illegal drugs; Trafficking in Cocaine, Illegal Drugs, Marijuana, or Methamphetamine; Possession of Marijuana with Intent to Distribute; and Tampering with Evidence. During this 9-month joint investigation, approximately 778 grams of suspected methamphetamine and 9,000 grams of suspected marijuana was seized. This investigation is active and ongoing. More arrests and charges are expected.
- Region 11 On Wednesday, September 4, 2024, GBI's Region 11 Athens Field Office was requested by Barrow County Sheriff's Office to investigate a school shooting that occurred at Apalachee High School in Winder, GA. Two students and two teachers were shot and killed during the shooting. Nine additional people (8 students, 1 teacher) were injured and taken to various hospitals with injuries. GBI Agents, Georgia State Patrol Troopers, local law enforcement and first responders were on scene within minutes. The 14-year-old subject (Colt Gray) was taken into custody without incident. On September 5th, the father of the 14-year-old subject (Colin Gray) was arrested for his role in his son having access to the rifle that was used in the school shooting.

By midnight September 4, over 400 leads had been conducted, to include contacting students, teachers and other faculty and administration. GBI's crime scene specialists remained on scene two and a half days, until early afternoon Friday, September 6, 2024, conducting well over 100 Leica scans. Leads were followed piecing together timelines before and during the shooting. Region 11, along with supervisors, agents, analysts, DFIs, and crime scene specialists from 12 other GBI work units, Georgia State Patrol, Georgia Emergency Management, Department of Natural Resources, FBI Atlanta Division, local law enforcement and first responders assisted Barrow County Sheriff's Office. GBI's Georgia Information Sharing and Analysis Center (GISAC) supervisors and analysts set up on scene the day of the shootings and have continued to monitor and track numerous potential threats that developed the following days. GISAC and GBI work units have been working with local agencies investigating over 400 school threats, identifying, arresting, and prosecuting those making the threats.

Region 1 – On August 30, 2024, GBI's Region 1 – Calhoun Field Office and the Walker County Sheriff's Office announced the arrest of Clarence George, age 63, of Alabama, in the murder investigation of Julie Ann McDonald. After 24 years, GBI agents charged George with murder and aggravated assault in connection with McDonald's death. On August 22, 2024, the U.S. Marshals Service arrested George in Birmingham, Alabama.

On June 11, 2000, the body of Julie McDonald was discovered in her home on Arnold Lane in Lafayette, GA. The Walker County Sheriff's Office asked the GBI to assist in the murder investigation. Both agencies worked diligently to solve the case but were unable to at that time. Between 2015-2016, the case was reviewed by a Walker County detective and a GBI Special Agent, who both made tremendous progress in the case. Investigators resubmitted evidence for testing, but the tests were unable to identify a suspect at that time. Between 2023-2024, a Walker County Lieutenant and a GBI Special Agent again reexamined the case and retested evidence in the investigation. The efforts of the detectives and GBI agents led to the murder and aggravated assault charges on George. George was taken to the Jefferson County Jail in Birmingham, Alabama where he is awaiting extradition back to Georgia for these charges.

- Middle Georgia Gang Task Force (MGGTF) On August 23, 2024, the GBI arrested 7 people in Washington County, Georgia, following a joint drug investigation by the GBI's MGGTF, the Georgia State Patrol (GSP), the Georgia Department of Community Supervision (DCS), the Georgia Department of Corrections (GDC), and the Washington County Sheriff's Office. Charges included the Sale of Cocaine, Possession of Cocaine, Trafficking in Cocaine, Possession of Cocaine with the Intent to Distribute, Possession of Marijuana with the Intent to Distribute, Possession of a Firearm by a Convicted Felon, and Possession of a Knife during the Commission of a Felony. Following a 4-month joint investigation, GBI MGGTF arrested 4 people involved in drug sales in Washington County, GA. Law enforcement also executed multiple DCS search and arrest warrants. Following additional warrants, agents arrested 3 additional people on drug and gun charges. During the investigation, agents seized 1 rifle, approximately 50 grams of suspected crack cocaine, 14 grams of suspected powder cocaine, and approximately 28 grams of suspected marijuana.
- Office of Special Investigations (OSI) Cold Case Unit (CCU) The Coleman-Baker Act (CBA) request
 webform has been on the GBI website Home page since June 30, 2023. Thirty-two (32) cold cases are
 being reviewed at this time. Thirteen (13) were requests from designated family members and
 nineteen (19) were GBI initiated. CCU has also opened twelve (12) GBI cold case unidentified
 remains (UID) cases in hopes of identifying the victims with FIGG (Forensic Investigative Genetic
 Genealogy).
- From January 1 to September 30, 2024, the GBI has investigated a total of sixty-eight (68) Officer Involved Shootings (OIS). OIS number sixty-eight (68) was September 30, 2024. GBI's Region 10 Atlanta Regional Field Office was requested by the MARTA Police Department (PD). Officers responded to a robbery at the Oakland City MARTA station. As officers arrived, the suspect, Carnell Kelly, age 18, of Atlanta, ran out of the MARTA station. Officers pursued Kelly into James Orange Park. When officers confronted Kelly, he pulled out a knife. Officers ordered Kelly to drop the knife. When officers attempted to arrest Kelly, he grabbed his knife and engaged in a struggle with officers. During the struggle, the officer's gun was fired. No one was hit by the gunfire. An officer deployed a taser and Kelly was arrested without further incident. EMS was requested but Kelly declined treatment. Kelly was taken from the scene by MARTA PD, who took charges against Kelly. No one was injured during the incident. The GBI will conduct an independent investigation. Once complete, the case file will be given to the Fulton County District Attorney's Office for review.



Combined DNA Index System (CODIS)




