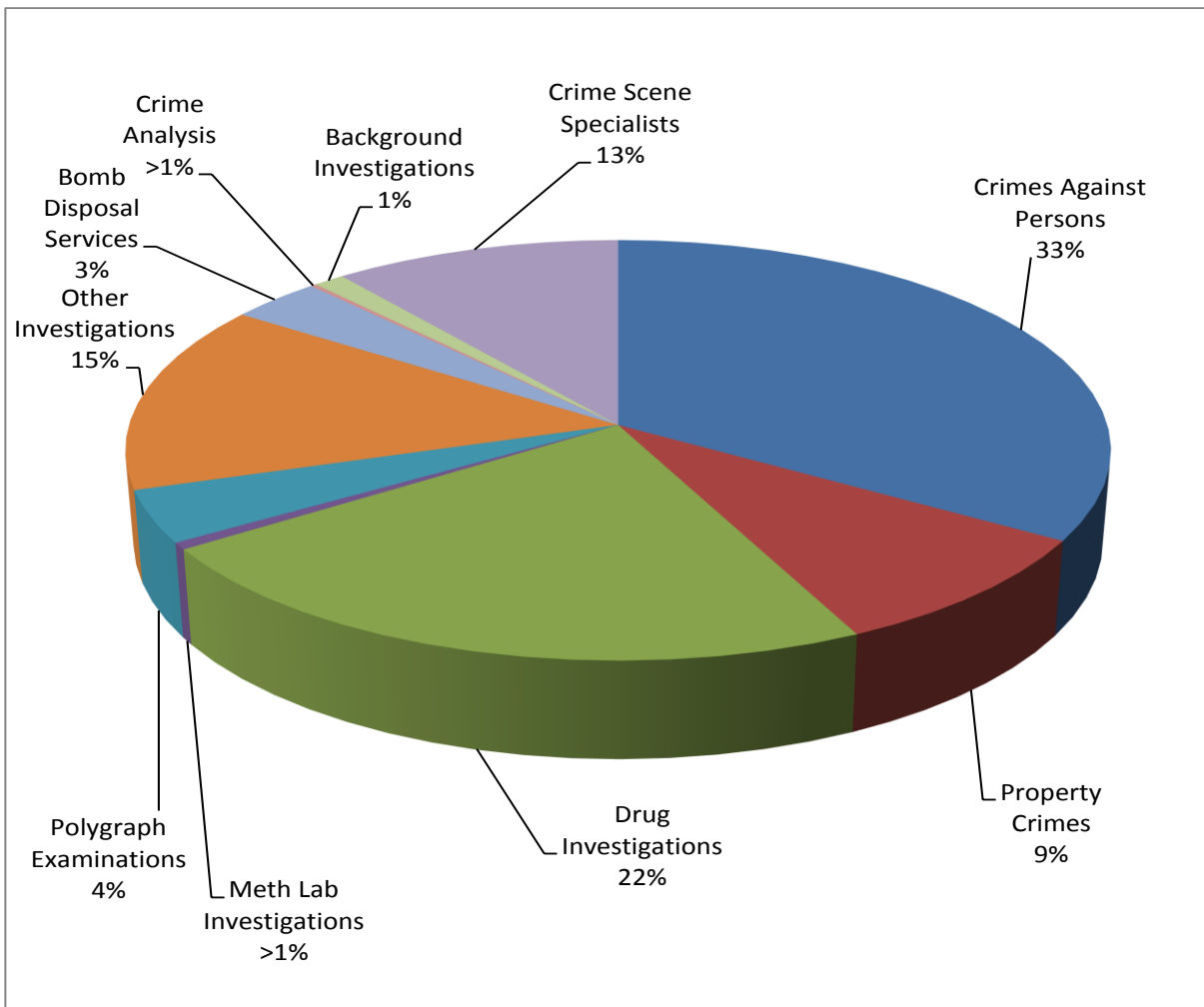

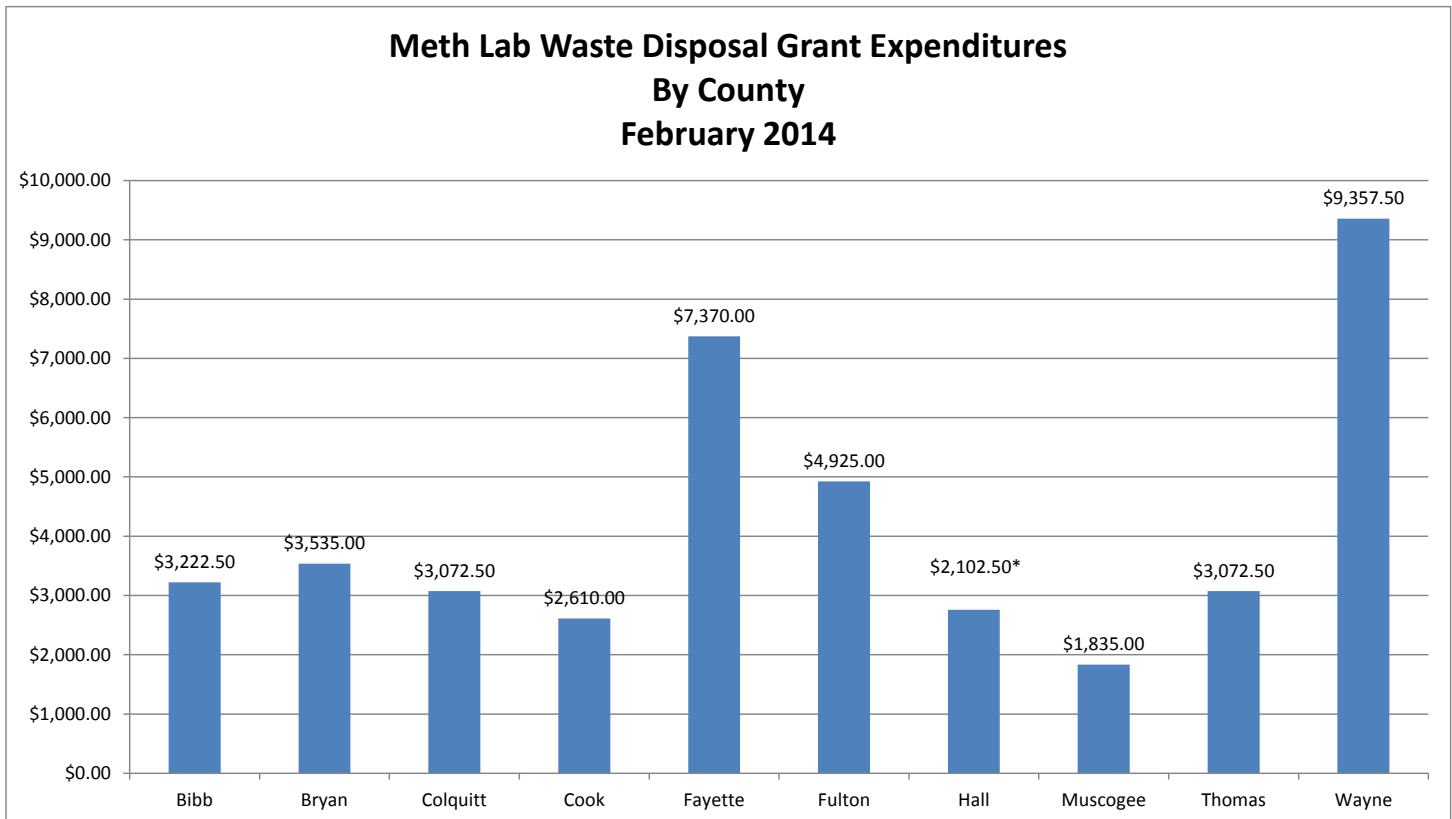

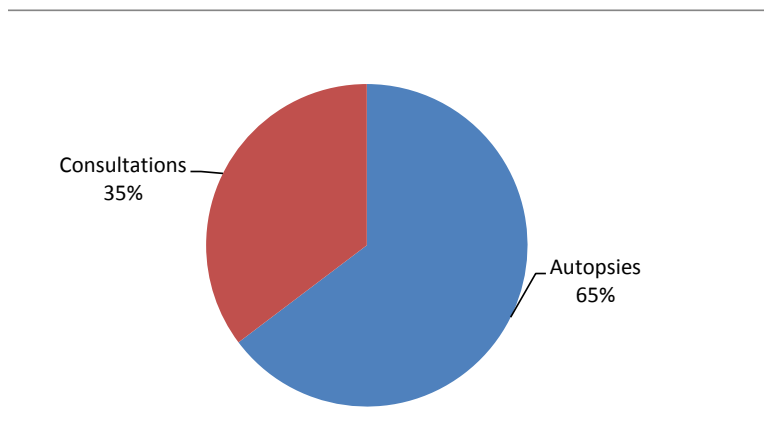

## ***Compliance and Customer Support***

### **1. Customer Training**

GCIC personnel provided 297.75 hours of training to 834 criminal justice agency employees during the month. The total number hours of training conducted during **FY2014: 2076**

### **2. Compliance Audits**

GCIC conducted (13) full service audits; (11) on-site audits conducted for agencies with “inquiry only” access from the CJIS network; (0) criminal justice E-Audits; and (24) fingerprint/disposition audits for the month. The total number of audits conducted during **FY2014: 420**.

## ***Projects***

### **AFIS REPLACEMENT**

**Project Description--** GCIC replaced the Georgia Bureau of Investigation’s 22 year old Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). The AFIS replacement enhanced fingerprint identification services to permit identification of criminals more rapidly through the use of state of the art alternative search methods and information sharing. Phase II of the project focuses on the Image Archive system expansion. The expansion allows divisions within GBI to store documents and easily retrieve when needed.

The project is in Phase III which focuses on the FBI’s Next Generation Identification (NGI) Increment 3 implementation which introduces two new features: palm submission capability and the use of the EFS (Extended Feature Set) profiles for latent searches of AFIS systems.

Phase III includes the NEC Integrated Fingerprint Workstation (IFW) and Interoperability Interface applications that support the exchange of information related to the FBI NGI Increment 3 transaction types.

Listed below are the functional areas of NGI Increment 3 transaction type support:

1. FBI interoperability support for systems other than an NEC AFIS [i.e. Universal Latent Workstation (ULW) or other dissimilar AFIS] to send transactions through the GBI connection to and from the FBI.
2. Initiating and receiving supported transactions from the NEC workstation directly to the FBI.
3. Interoperability to the GBI AFIS from external systems.

### **Accomplishments This Reporting Period**

NGI Increment 3:

- Tenprint/Latent Inquiry (T/LI) Hit/No Hit report acceptance.

## **SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY REDESIGN**

**Project Description** - In October 2012 GBI implemented a new sex offender management application, Sex Offender Registry Tool (SORT). SORT is a more modernized system that uses the latest web technologies to provide local law enforcement access to centralized up-to-date information of sex offenders in their jurisdictions. Local agency staff has direct access to offender data with limited administrative authority to manage users.

The remaining phases of the project include the implementation of the SORT Public Website and the establishment of a web service between the SORT and Department of Corrections' SCRIBE system for data transfer. Additional phases include the integration of SORT with the NEC Image Archive (AFIS/IA) and customized photo and reporting enhancements.

### **Accomplishments This Reporting Period**

- Added--Expand photos to viewable size on Public Website
- Added--Search offenders by offense on Public Website
- Redirect GANet SOR Public Website to SORT Public Website
- Developed interface with National Sex Offender Public Website (NSOPW) in test environment
- GDC provided field edits for web service interface with SORT

## **SERVER CONSOLIDATION**

**Project Description** – The Georgia Technology Authority (GTA) will be consolidating production, test and developmental servers to the NADC. Consolidation and virtualization will enable the State to reduce the number of servers being supported.

### **Accomplishments This Reporting Period**

## **ADVANCED AUTHENTICATION (AA)**

**Project Description** — GBI is working with RSA to implement a solution that will meet requirements outlined in the FBI CJIS Security Policy 5.3 for AA.. The RSA product will integrate seamlessly with the State of Georgia's existing SSL VPN and will offer a comprehensive multi-factor layered protection for all users.



### Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- GBI previously completed two phases of User Acceptance Testing (UAT) that included GBI User, Admin role and Vendor roles. Some of the users within the Admin role experienced issues with resetting their password and with log-in challenges within the Active Directory user groups. The GBI continues to work with AT&T and MegaPath to research the issues.

### **SORNA REALLOCATION GRANT**

**Project Description** - GBI received a Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) grant award from the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) to assist the State in moving towards compliance with the SORNA portion of the Adam Walsh Act. One of the line items within this grant is the purchase of live scan devices to be used by the Georgia Department of Corrections (GDC) to capture fingerprints and palm prints to verify the identity of individuals entering the State Prison system. Another item included in this grant is the configuration of CCH to accept information from the GBI Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS).

**Monthly Update** – The GBI did not receive any feedback from DOC concerning the progress regarding a decision to purchase Live Scan devices. Additional data on functions and certified vendors was sent to DOC.

### Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- Unisys provided the task order details of the work that is required to pass DNA status information from the GBI Laboratory Information Management System (LIMS) to the Computerized Criminal History (CCH) system via the Law Enforcement Message Switch (LEMS/JX). The work is planned to be completed one month after the start date of the task order. Kick-off meeting is scheduled for 3/7 (Task Projected End date: April 2014)
- A Project Change Request (PCR) to modify CCH to accept profiled DNA information from CODIS was completed by CourtView. The GBI is modifying the PCR before providing a signature.

### **FILE SERVICES TRANSFORMATION/CONSOLIDATION**

**Project Description--** Move designated GBI File Server data from existing legacy hardware to new operationally stable and supportable hardware.

**Monthly Update** – Requested different architectures and backup storage solutions from GTA/IBM to meet our needs and meeting with outside vendors for alternative solutions so we can make a business decision.

### Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- Arranged and coordinated backup storage solution meetings with vendors.
