



# Investigative Hours Expended YTD FY2019





#### PLANS & PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

### **CHILD FATALITY SYSTEM REVIEW PROJECT**

**Project Description** - The Child Fatality Review (CFR) unit requested an enhancement to their current process to capture Medical Examiners (ME) data for child related deaths in the State of Georgia and have asked for additional reporting capabilities.

**Monthly Update** - There are no accomplishments for this reporting period.

#### CRIMINAL JUSTICE EXCHANGE PROJECT (CJEP)

**Project Description** – CJEP will incorporate the electronic exchanges of information between state and local criminal justice agencies in Georgia and will involve the coordination of multiple agencies and vendor applications. The goals of the project are to create seamless connections between systems, establish a single, consistent architecture adopted to guide all aspects of program implementation and to establish a governance structure that views criminal justice as a statewide community.

**Monthly Update** - The core team began holding daily cadence meetings to discuss the progress of user acceptance testing. The release date for the e-Filing exchange is scheduled for early to mid-November for Dawson, Gordon and Forsyth counties. The Bartow e-Filing exchange is scheduled for late November and Secondary Exchanges are estimated to be implemented March/April 2019.

#### CUSTOMER RELATIONSHIP MANAGEMENT (CRM) APPLICATION PROJECT

**Project Description -** The CRM Application Project will provide a single source of historical interaction with GCIC external customers. The application will give GCIC end users the ability to search, track and report customer interactions throughout GCIC's business units.


**Monthly Update** - The CRM team continues to contact agencies for validation of their ORI and contact information. All CRM documentation (RFQ, Charter, Meeting Minutes) was reviewed. CRM Customer Portal website beta testing has started, and the application developer made some corrections and continues to update forms. The email routing feature is not working, and Microsoft has been contacted for further assistance.


#### **CUSTOMER SUPPORT - TRAINING**

**Project Description -** The Customer Support Training group provides training in GCIC programs, GCIC applications, GCIC/FBI compliance to criminal justice agencies across the State of Georgia. The group extends the option to receive classroom training or training within an e-Learning environment.

**Monthly Update** -. The trainings completed online and within the classrooms for the month are included in the charts. The LMS Staff handled 234 phone calls, 916 emails and managed LMS user account additions.







#### **DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE (DOR) DRIVES PROJECT**

**Project Description** - The purpose of this project is to document, configure, integrate, and test two interfaces with the new DOR Driver Record and Integrated Vehicle Enterprise System (DRIVES). The two new interfaces will use existing LEMS Web Services capabilities with National Information Exchange Model (NIEM) Extensible Markup Language (XML) message formats. One interface will be used to send and receive vehicle registration queries and responses to and from DRIVES. The other interface will be used to receive stolen vehicle requests and responses to and from DRIVES.

**Monthly Update** - GBI continues to make changes and modifications in the test environment. GBI IT worked with the vendor and DOR to install and configure application software to allow communication between DOR and GBI via a web service connection. GCIC contacted Nlets to configure transactions coming to and from DRIVES to be NIEM compliant. A service ticket was submitted requesting an upgrade of the existing system to R2 which will accommodate the latest .NET framework and LEMS application versions.

#### GEORGIA APPLICANT PROCESSING SERVICE (GAPS) PROJECT

**Project Description -** The Georgia Crime Information Center Information Services is seeking to obtain the services of a qualified and experienced vendor to provide an applicant fingerprinting solution that will electronically capture and submit applicant fingerprints to the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). In addition, the selected vendor shall handle receiving fingerprint search results and disseminate the results to the requestor.

**Monthly Update** - Bi-weekly meetings are held to receive status updates on development milestones. The vendor is continuing development of the new GAPS. Updated GUI screenshots were approved by GBI.

#### **HUMAN RESOURCES (HR) TIMESHEET PROJECT**

**Project Description** - Enhancement of the application used by non-sworn units of the GBI for tracking time.

**Monthly Update** – The project manager discussed the remaining requirements with the stakeholder and developer. The project will be placed on hold until a programmer is assigned.

#### NATIONAL INCIDENT-BASED REPORTING SYSTEM (NIBRS) PROJECT

**Project Description** - The National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) collects data on each single incident and arrest for each offense coming to the attention of law enforcement for which specific facts about each crime is collected. GBI is in the process of replacing the current UCR summary-based system with an application that will collect incident-based data.

**Monthly Update** - The vendor continues to work on the error report and the estimated timeframe for completion is 6 weeks.

#### SEX OFFENDER REGISTRY TOOL (SORT) ENHANCEMENT PROJECT

**Project Description** - System enhancements for the SORT application. Phase 1 will consist of modifications to the application used by Sheriff's Offices, the public website, NCIC web services and SORT Reports. Phase 2 will focus on the web service between SORT and AFIS for the upload of SORT documentation.

**Monthly Update** - The programmer completed updates within the SOR system such as the correction of invalid cities and the city dropdown option, as well as making the county field mandatory. Additional changes and updates include preventing the deletion of primary addresses and IA integration.

#### SHAREPOINT CONFIGURATION PROJECT

**Project Description** - The SharePoint tool will be used as an internal web portal for organizing and sharing information as an employee collaborative tool for internal communication. The portal will also include an Intranet application for each of the three GBI divisions that would allow content management, document repository and information sharing of announcements, news and department information.

**Monthly Update** - There are no accomplishments for this reporting period.
