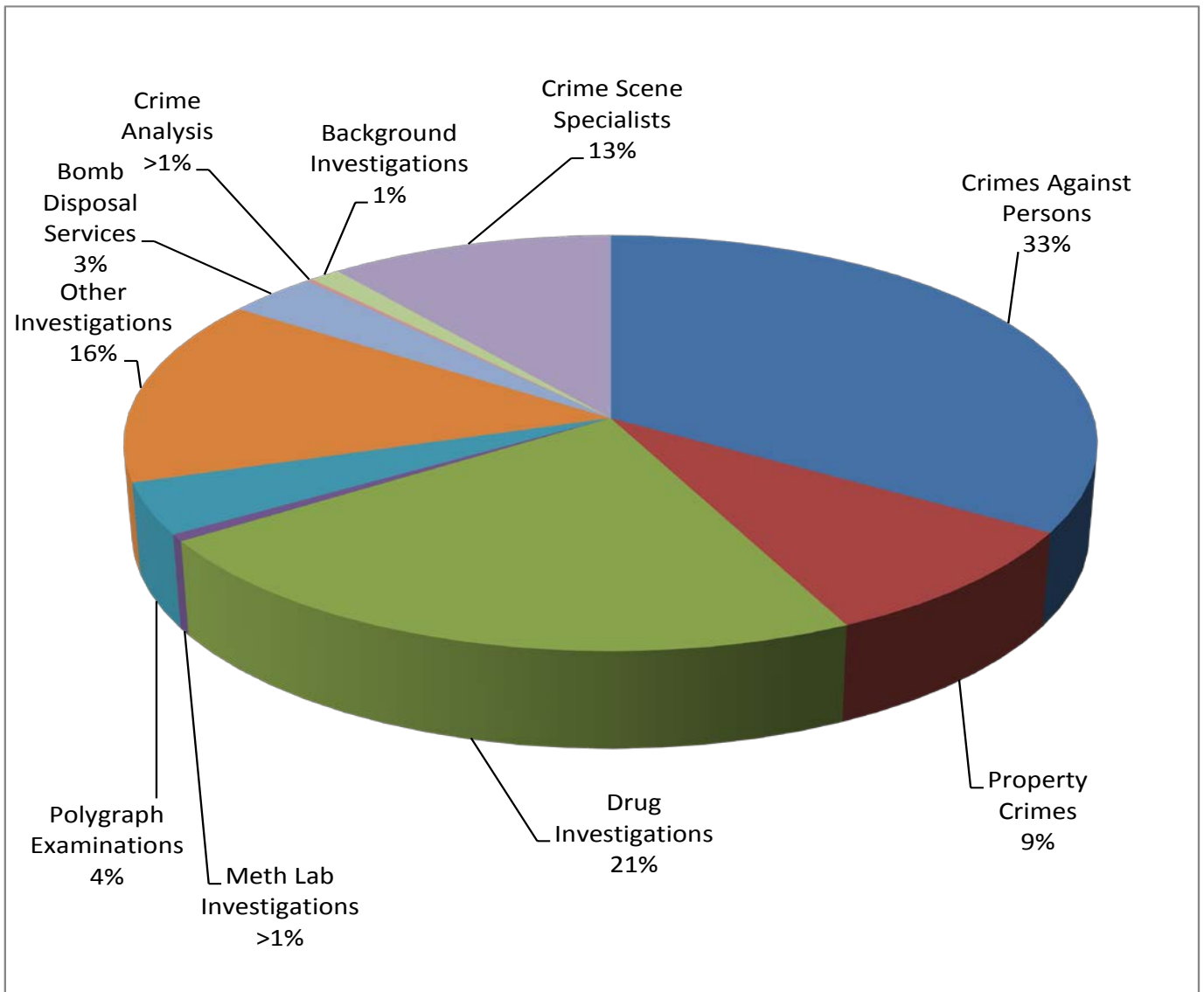

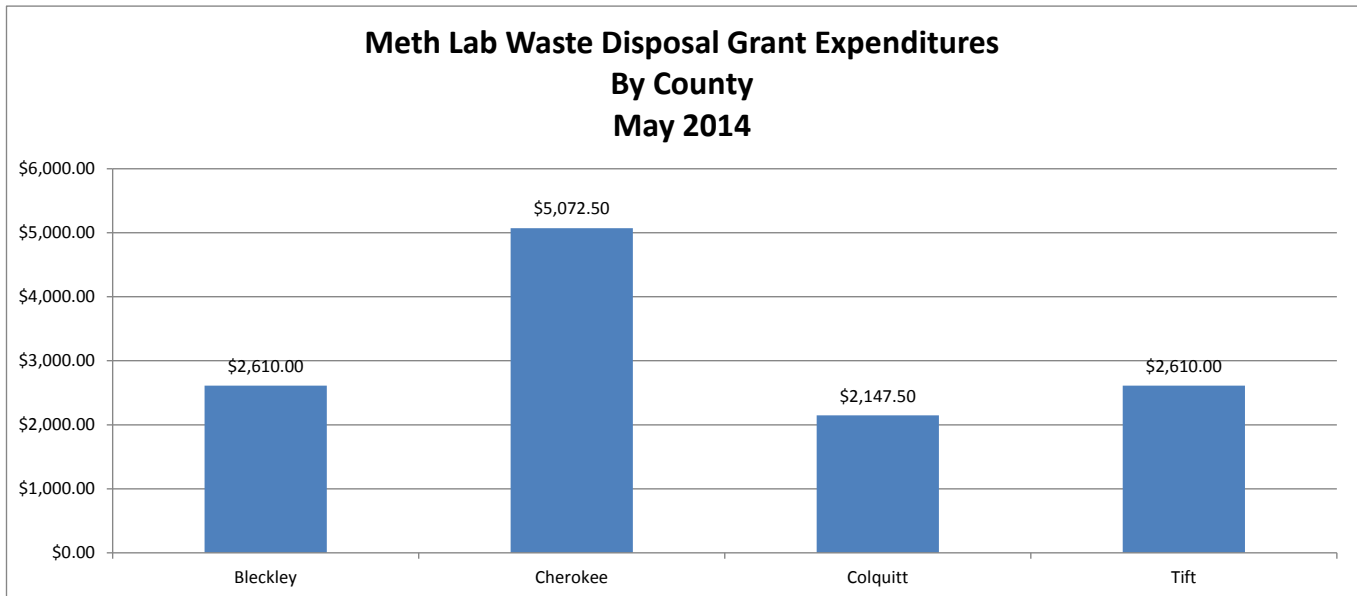

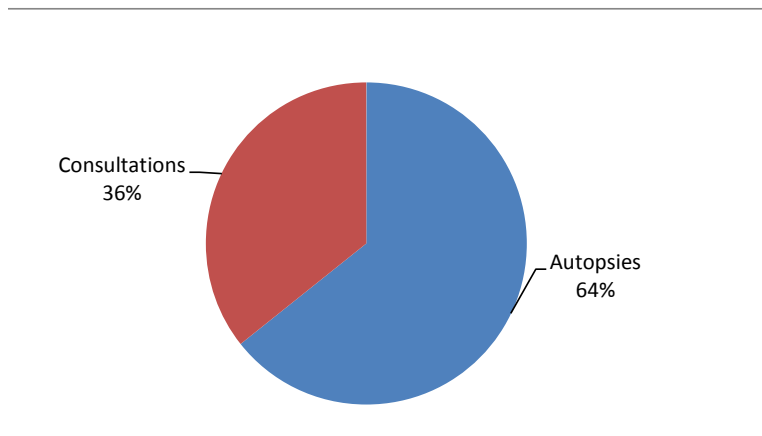

## ***Projects***

### **Plans & Program Development—May 2014 Monthly Report**

#### **AFIS Replacement**

**Project Description--** GCIC replaced the Georgia Bureau of Investigation's 22 year old Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). The AFIS replacement enhanced fingerprint identification services to permit identification of criminals more rapidly through the use of state of the art alternative search methods and information sharing. Phase II of the project focuses on the Image Archive system expansion. The expansion allows divisions within GBI to store documents and easily retrieve when needed.

The project is in Phase III which focuses on the FBI's Next Generation Identification (NGI) Increment 3 implementation which introduces two new features: palm submission capability and the use of the EFS (Extended Feature Set) profiles for latent searches of AFIS systems.

Phase III includes the NEC Integrated Fingerprint Workstation (IFW) and Interoperability Interface applications that support the exchange of information related to the FBI NGI Increment 3 transaction types.

Listed below are the functional areas of NGI Increment 3 transaction type support:

1. FBI interoperability support for systems other than an NEC AFIS [i.e. Universal Latent Workstation (ULW) or other dissimilar AFIS'] to send transactions through the GBI connection to and from the FBI.
2. Initiating and receiving supported transactions from the NEC workstation directly to the FBI.
3. Interoperability to the GBI AFIS from external systems.

#### **Accomplishments This Reporting Period**

NGI Increment 3:

- AFIS/TNET enhancement purchase order entered

#### **Sex Offender Registry Redesign Project**

**Project Description -** In October 2012 GBI implemented a new sex offender management application, Sex Offender Registry Tool (SORT). SORT is a more modernized system that uses the latest web technologies to provide local law enforcement access to centralized up-to-date information of sex offenders in their jurisdictions. Local agency staff has direct access to offender data with limited administrative authority to manage users.

The remaining phases of the project include the implementation of the SORT Public Website and the establishment of a web service between the SORT and Department of Corrections' SCRIBE system for data transfer. Additional phases include the integration of SORT with the NEC Image Archive (AFIS/IA) and customized photo and reporting enhancements.

**Monthly Update –** The SORT project team continues to monitor SORT transactions. SORT has begun the transition from the legacy environment to the SCON environment.

## Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- The following changes/updates to SORT Admin were backed out of production in the Legacy environment due to errors that occurred:
  - Improved geocoding on address screens (address, employment and school).
    - Latitude, Longitude and AutoGeocode checkbox are not visible when adding a new record; geocoding occurs when the record is saved.
    - Latitude, Longitude and AutoGeocode checkbox is visible for existing records that have map coordinates. Checking the AutoGeocode checkbox causes geocoding to occur prior to saving the address.
    - The screen does not re-render when the street number, street or zip code is modified.
  - Made the SORT primary address a required field
    - An address of any type is not added, modified or deleted without establishing a current, primary address
  - Corrected the responsible agency-Ware county that was defaulting to Delaware
  - Offender Verification Screen – corrected the sort process of the date to allow editing of the most recent verification date entry.
  - Image Type Differentiation
    - Require an image type for the entry of new images and existing images uploaded to SORT.
- The following changes/updates were backed out of the SORT Public Website due to errors that occurred:
  - Implemented the Community Notifications feature to notify citizens when an offender's current, primary address is within range of the address they've registered with NSOPR.
  - Question Category Dropdown Box—default the dropdown box to a blank entry and require the user to select a category

## Server Consolidation Project

**Project Description** – The Georgia Technology Authority (GTA) will be consolidating production, test and developmental servers to the NADC. Consolidation and virtualization will enable the State to reduce the number of servers being supported.

**Monthly Update** – Last Business Council meeting held May 21, 2014.

## Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- CCH Test Application stabilized.
- New projected dates from UAT work session were presented to Business Council.
- DOR Stolen Vehicle Report transaction issue through ESB/MF connection resolved.

## Advanced Authentication

**Project Description** — GBI is working with RSA to implement a solution that will meet requirements outlined in the FBI CJIS Security Policy 5.0 for advanced authentication. The RSA



product will integrate seamlessly with the State of Georgia's existing SSL VPN and will offer a comprehensive multi-factor layered protection for all users.

**Monthly Update** – The GBI continues to make progress in the implementation of the Advanced Authentication services to integrate with the SSLX-VPN product.

#### Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- RSA, Advanced Authentication software vendor, completed review of application logs to ensure the Advanced Authentication configuration is correct.

#### RapidID 2-Factor Advanced Authentication

**Project Description:** The software client for the RapidID Motorola MC75 devices was modified to include a fingerprint enrollment in the user logon procedure. Each user is required to enter a username, password and fingerprint of the left index finger as an enhancement of advanced authentication for the MC75 devices.

The software upgrade is deployed to each MC75 device by an automatic software update process which prompts each user to enroll the fingerprint using the device scanner. The upgrade is deployed in three phases of two week intervals with the final phase ending May 30, 2014.

The Cogent Bluecheck device will rely on the authentication used by the paired PC. The software client for the Cogent CSD-450 device was modified to support fingerprint enrollment for the advanced authentication upgrade. A web service was created to allow 3<sup>rd</sup> party systems to submit fingerprints to the RapidID server for user authentication.

#### Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- The roll-out of the new software update was completed; the upgrade was deployed to a total of 86 agencies plus 26 prison facilities.
  - 74 of 86 agencies completed the software update; the remaining 12 agencies must complete the update by June 30, 2014.

#### SORNA Reallocation Grant Project

**Project Description** - GBI received a Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) grant award from the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) to assist the State in moving towards compliance with the SORNA portion of the Adam Walsh Act. One of the line items within this grant is the purchase of live scan devices to be used by the Georgia Department of Corrections (GDC) to capture fingerprints and palm prints to verify the identity of individuals entering the State Prison system. Another item included in this grant is the configuration of CCH to accept information from the GBI Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS).

**Monthly Update** – – CJCC denied the request to reallocate funds that were previously allocated to purchase Live Scan devices for GDC and instead purchase Live Scan devices for local Sheriff's offices. CJCC approved the extension of the grant expiration date to December 31, 2014.

### Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- Unisys completed the Information Exchange Package Documentation (IEPD) required to pass DNA status information from the GBI Laboratory Information Management System (LIMS) to the Computerized Criminal History (CCH) system via the Law Enforcement Message Switch (LEMS/JX). The IEPD document is currently being reviewed by the Lab and the CCH vendor, CourtView. (Task Projected End date: June 2014)

### **File Services Transformation/Consolidation Project**

**Project Description--** Move identified GBI File Server data from existing legacy hardware to new operationally stable and supportable hardware.

**Monthly Update** – Continuing with GETS R2D2 solution for INV File Services storage.

### Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- \$440,000 approved for INV/DOFS TEAMS for backup storage SAN and Assureon devices and services.

### **Georgia Secondary Metal Recycler Project**

**Project Description** – O.C.G.A. 10-1-360.1 and 10-1-353 require that GBI establish and maintain a database of required purchase transaction information from secondary metal recyclers that is accessible and searchable by Georgia law enforcement agencies.

**Monthly Update** – The secondary metals recycler RFP posted on 5/15/14 and will close 6/30/14.

### Accomplishments This Reporting Period

- RFP completed and posted to the state purchasing website.
